

**Biographical Note of Dr. Syed Kaleem Imam (Pakistan)**  
**Acting Police Commissioner, African Union - United Nations Mission in Darfur**

Dr. Syed Kaleem Imam of Pakistan was appointed Deputy Police Commissioner (Operations) for the African Union - United Nations Mission in Darfur (UNAMID) on 10 October 2011 by United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon and African Union Chairperson Jean Ping. Since 17 November 2012, he has been serving in the additional capacity of Acting Police Commissioner.

The Acting Police Commissioner brings with him more than 25 years of experience at the national and international level, having worked in post-conflict communities in the areas of conflict resolution, mediation, humanitarian assistance, and protection. Prior to joining UNAMID, he had served in UN peacekeeping operations in Mozambique and Liberia and most recently was Inspector General of Police in Islamabad, Pakistan.

Born in Karachi, Pakistan, in 1962, Dr. Imam holds a LLM in Human Rights from the University of London's School of Oriental and African Studies and a Ph.D. in Politics and International Relations from the International Islamic University, Islamabad.

Dr. Imam is married and has three children.
