SURINAME NATIONAL ACTION PLAN FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION 1540 (2004)

Suriname is not a producer, possessor or trader in nuclear, chemical and biological weapons. Since the adoption of UNSCR 1540 (2004), Suriname has endeavored to strengthen both laws and practical implementation measures to ensure adherence to the non-proliferation objectives of the resolution.

Suriname's commitment to WMD non-proliferation is also evident in its ratification of all three of the main WMD international treaties: the Nuclear Non-proliferation Treaty, the Chemical Weapons Convention and the Biological Weapons Convention. Suriname continues to make progress in UNSCR 1540 implementation efforts and demonstrates participation in the global effort of countering proliferation of nuclear, chemical and biological weapons.

To further progress UNSCR 1540 implementation, Suriname is in the process of contemplating adoption of a Chemical Weapons Implementation Bill to implement the country's international chemical weapons-related obligations. In this regard, this Bill would specifically address some of the mandatory obligations contained in the operative paragraphs of UNSCR 1540.

UNSCR 1977 (2011) and UNSCR 2325 (2016) encourage all Member States to prepare, on a voluntary basis, national implementation action plans, with the assistance of the 1540 Committee as appropriate, in order to map out their priorities and plans for implementing the key provisions of UNSCR 1540 (2004), and to submit those plans to the 1540 Committee. Suriname remains firmly committed to supporting the objectives of UNSCR 1540 (2004) and submits this National Action Plan both as a demonstration of this commitment and as a way of charting a way forward for further implementation strengthening initiatives.

The primary purpose of this voluntary National Action Plan is to identify actions that can be taken to enhance the capacity of the Government of Suriname to implement UNSCR 1540 (2004) and work with States, the 1540 Committee, donors and technical assistance providers to materialize the plan. It is also intended to be a guidance tool for national stakeholders to work towards meeting the stated objectives.



Suriname has identified three levels of measures to implement the 1540 Resolution:

- **Level 1** Actions that the Government of Suriname may take in the near term with no, or very limited, external support.
- Level 2 Actions that Suriname may undertake with the support of partners as part of its 1540 technical assistance package as well as the 1540 Committee and other assistance providers.
- **Level 3** Actions that may require additional mobilization of resources for their implementation as well as assistance from other partners.
