United Nations Decade of Education for Sustainable Development

The General Assembly,

Recalling chapter 36 of Agenda 21, on promoting education, public awareness

and training, adopted at the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development, held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, from 3 to 14 June 1992,

Recalling the work programme on education, public awareness and training adopted by the Commission on Sustainable Development at its fourth session in 1996 and elaborated at its sixth session in 1998,

Recalling also the relevant provisions of the Plan of Implementation of the World Summit on Sustainable Development ("Johannesburg Plan of Implementation") on education, in particular its provision 124 (d) on the United Nations Decade of Education for Sustainable Development,

Recalling further its resolutions 57/254 of 20 December 2002 and 58/219 of 23 December 2003,

Welcoming the fact that the Commission on Sustainable Development, at its eleventh session, identified education as one of the cross-cutting issues of its multi-year programme of work,

Reaffirming the internationally agreed development goal of achieving universal primary education, in particular that by 2015 children everywhere, boys and girls alike, will be able to complete a full course of primary schooling,

Taking note of the oral report of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization regarding its preparation for the United Nations Decade of Education for Sustainable Development given at the 59th session of General Assembly,

Emphasizing that education is an indispensable element for achieving sustainable development,

1. *Reaffirms* that education for sustainable development is critical for promoting sustainable development, and recalls in this regard **that the United** Nations Decade of Education for Sustainable Development will begin on 1 January 2005,

2. Takes note of the draft of the International Implementation Scheme prepared by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, in coordination with other relevant United Nations agencies and programmes, and requests the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, as the designated lead agency, to continue to promote the United Nations Decade of Education for Sustainable Development, in cooperation with Governments, the United Nations and other relevant international organizations, non-governmental organizations and other stakeholders; 3. *Calls* upon United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization to distribute the draft International Implementation Scheme to all Member States for their comments, with a view to expeditiously finalizing the International Implementation Scheme,

4. *Encourages* Governments to consider the inclusion of measures to implement the United Nations Decade of Education for Sustainable Development in their respective educational strategies and national development plans by 2005, in consultation with all stakeholders and taking into account, as appropriate, the finalized International Implementation Scheme,

5. *Invites* Governments to promote public awareness of and wider participation in the United Nations Decade of Education for Sustainable Development, including through cooperation with and initiatives engaging civil society and other relevant stakeholders, **especially upon the beginning of the United Nations Decade of Education for Sustainable Development;**

6. *Requests* the Secretary-General to call upon the Director-General of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization to prepare a report on the implementation of the United Nations Decade of Education for Sustainable Development for submission to the General Assembly at its sixty-fifth session under the agenda sub-item "Mid-term review of the United Nations Decade of Education for Sustainable Development".
