

Dr. Norman T. Uphoff is Professor of Government and International Agriculture at Cornell University. He has been a faculty member at Cornell since 1970. Professor Uphoff currently holds the position of Program Leader for Sustainable Rice Systems, in the Cornell International Institute for Food, Agriculture and Development (CIIFAD). He served as CIIFAD's first director, from 1990 to 2005. He has published extensively on issues related to Participatory Development; Irrigation Management; Natural Resource Management and Sustainable Development; Agroecology, Ecoagriculture and Sustainable Agriculture; Food Security, Poverty and Environmental Issues, among others.

Most of his current work focuses on The System of Rice Intensification (SRI), which was developed in Madagascar some 25 years ago. Over the past 10 years, Professor Uphoff has made over 165 presentations on SRI and agroecology in 37 countries in Asia, Africa, Europe and Latin America, and most recently at the UNCSD inter-sessional meeting in Windhoek, February 9-10.
