

Mr. Tim Hanstad is President and CEO of the Rural Development Institute (RDI), an international nonprofit organization that has partnered with developing country governments to secure land rights for over 400 million of the world's poorest people. He has been with RDI since 1986 and has served as President and CEO since 2004. He is also an adjunct faculty member at the University of Washington School of Law, where he has co-directed a graduate program in Law of Sustainable International Development.

He has over 20 years of experience working with governments and civil society partners to expand land access, improve land tenure security, and develop land markets for the benefit of the rural poor in developing and transitional economies. His field experience extends to 15 countries in Asia, Eastern Europe, Africa, and Latin America, including four years living in India.

Mr. Hanstad has worked with numerous international donor agencies and foundations such as the World Bank, United Nations Food and Agricultural Organization, United Nations Development Programme, United Nations HABITAT, United States Agency for International Development, DFID, Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, Ford Foundation, Rockefeller Brothers Fund, Omidyar Network, and The John T.
