

Dr. Alemneh Dejene has been a Senior Officer of Sustainable Development Policy at the Natural Resource Management and Environment Department of the UN Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) since 1998. His key responsibilities include technical and policy advise and preparation of various technical documents, policy briefs and position papers in the area of sustainable development, follow-up of Agenda 21, CSD and WSSD, MDG-1 (eradicating hunger and poverty), MDG-7 (ensuring environmental sustainability) and NEPAD's Comprehensive African Agricultural Development (CAADP).

As a consultant with the World Bank, he undertook work in the design, appraisal and supervision of agricultural and natural resources management projects, including environmental impact assessment of agricultural and rural development investment projects.

Dr. Dejene has also engaged in field based research focusing on the link between environment/natural resources degradation and vulnerability to climate related risks among smallholders in fragile ecosystems (i.e. dryland and highland/mountain ecosystems) and policy measures to address these challenges.
