Call for Papers for a Special Section on Climate Change

For the November 2009 issue

Deadline: June 15, 2009

Articles should consider climate change-related issues with a sustainable development perspective, i.e. one that focuses on economic, social, and environmental aspects in an integrated way. The editor will consider papers on:

- Strategic approaches for **long-term cooperative action** to address climate change, including technology development, technology transfer and market-based opportunities;
- Concrete policies at the national level to promote **low-carbon growth and development**,
- Integration of climate change **in economic planning and decision making**, from a practical perspective (practical tools needed; links between research and policy; institutions needed; needs in capacity-building and training; examples of successful response frameworks for adaptation);
- Adaptation to climate change in **specific sectors** (e.g. agriculture), including financing, implementation, and institutional aspects;
- Innovative approaches integrating **adaptation to climate change** with broader sustainable development approaches.
