Resolution on Means of Implementation of SFM (1)



- Adopted 30 October 2009
- Facilitative Process: an essential component of the UNFF Strategy on Forest Financing
- The AHEG and the FP work in complementary and synergistic ways: (i) the AHEG provides a top-down approach with strategic guidance; (ii) the FP provides a bottom-up approach by producing data and facts from the field

Resolution on the Means of Implementation of SFM (2)

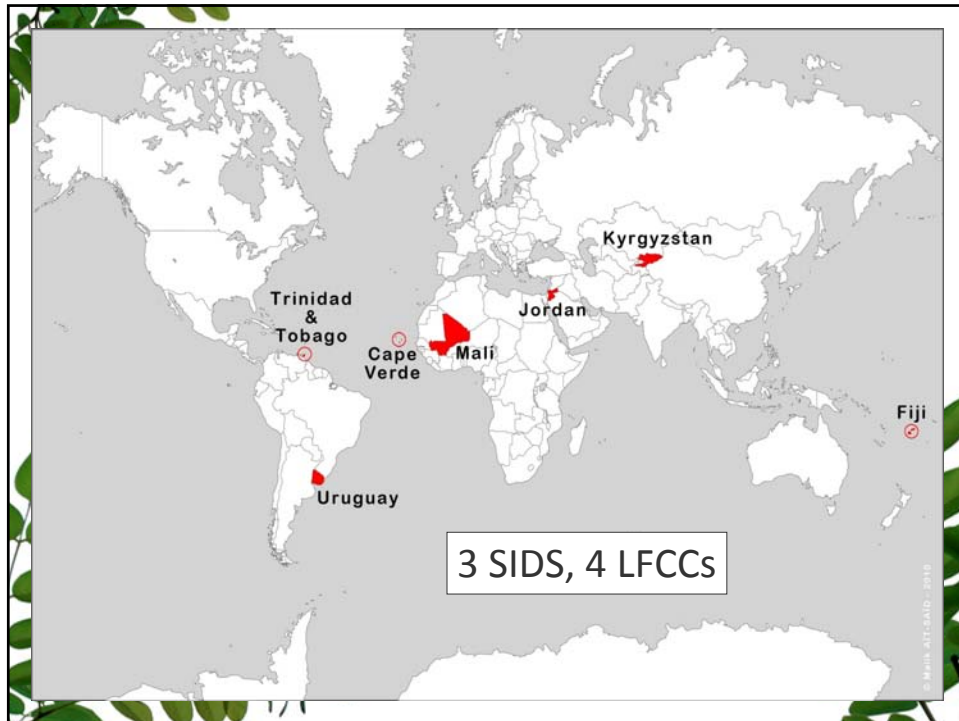


- Functions of Facilitative Process include:
 - to identify obstacles, gaps and opportunities for financing forests
 - to assist in mobilizing and supporting new and additional financial resources from all sources
 - these are only 2 of the 8 functions listed in the Resolution

SIDS and LFCCs (1)



- Forest Financing Project on Small Island Developing States and Low Forest Cover Countries
- Both categories suffered from a particularly sharp decline in forest financing
- Over \$1.5 million raised (DFID, GEF)
- Indufor Oy (Finland) hired in record time
- A novel cross-sectoral approach to forest financing



SIDS and LFCCs (3)





Upcoming activities:
