Purpose of the Workplan

- Responds to guidance by UNFF and other governing bodies of members
- Identifies the planned activities of the CPF over the period 2017-2020.
- Aligns with the United Nations Strategic Plan for Forests 2017-2030 (UNSPF) and the Quadrennial Programme of Work of the United Nations Forum on Forests (UNFF) for the period 2017-2020 (4POW).
- Takes into account other relevant forest-related agreements recognized in the UNSPF



Core functions of CPF

- Support the work of the UNFF and its member countries
- Provide scientific and technical advice to the UNFF and governing bodies of other CPF members, at their request;
- Enhance coherence and cooperation, as well as policy and programme and coordination, at all levels among its member organizations
- Promote the implementation of the UNFI and the UNSPF as well as the contribution of forests and trees to the 2030 Agenda and other major forest-related agreements.
