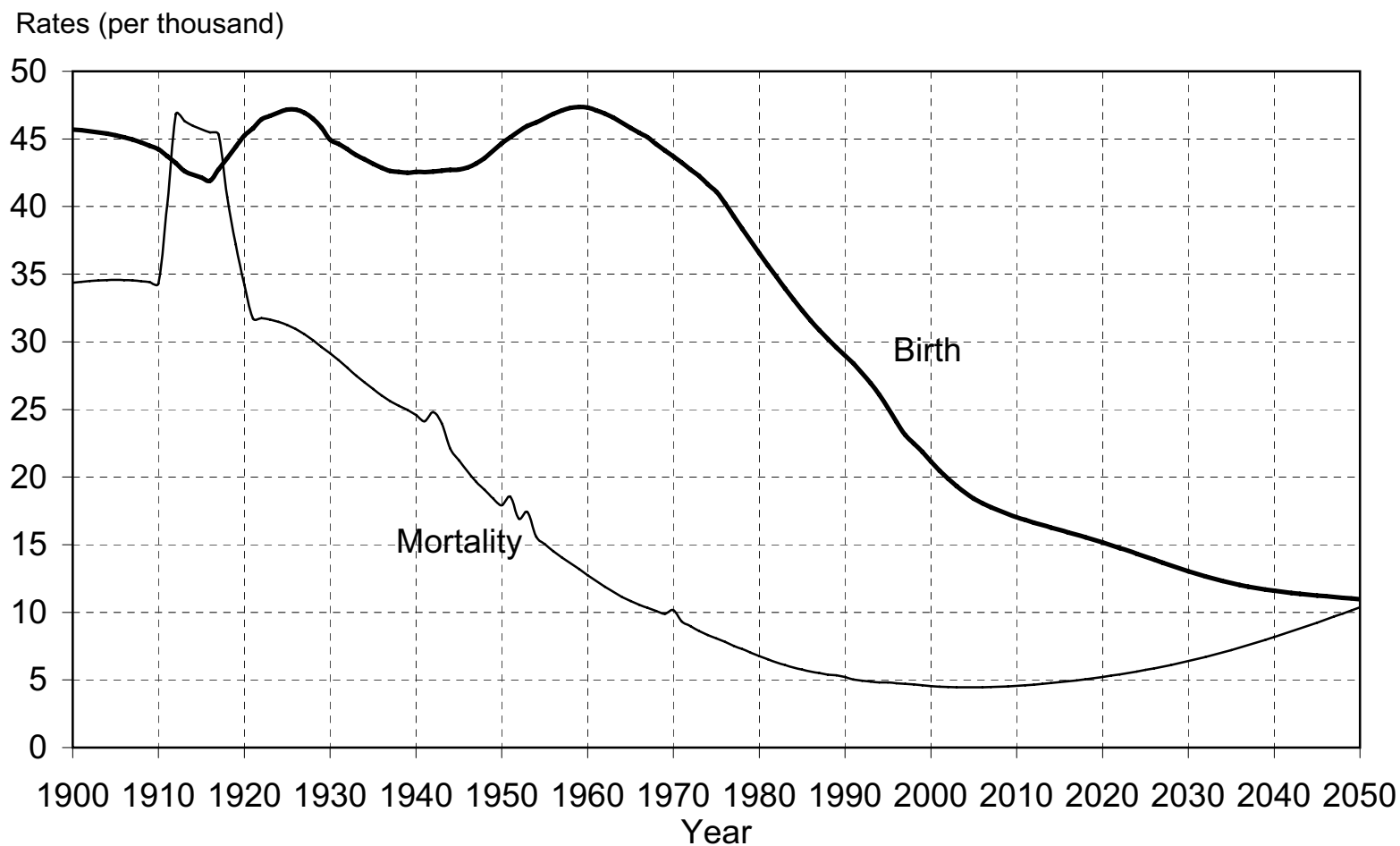
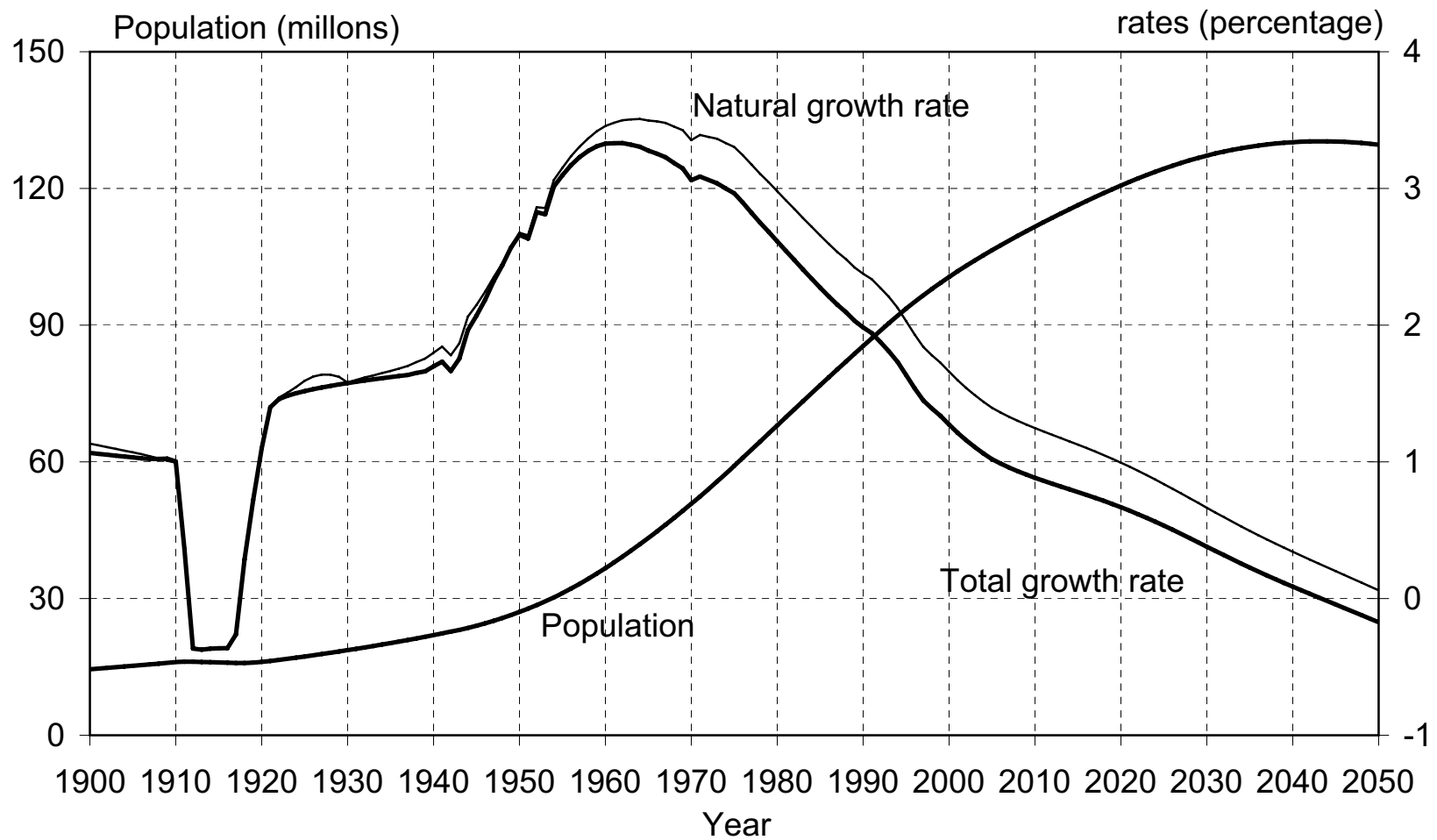


Figure 1. Demographic transition, Mexico, 1900-2050



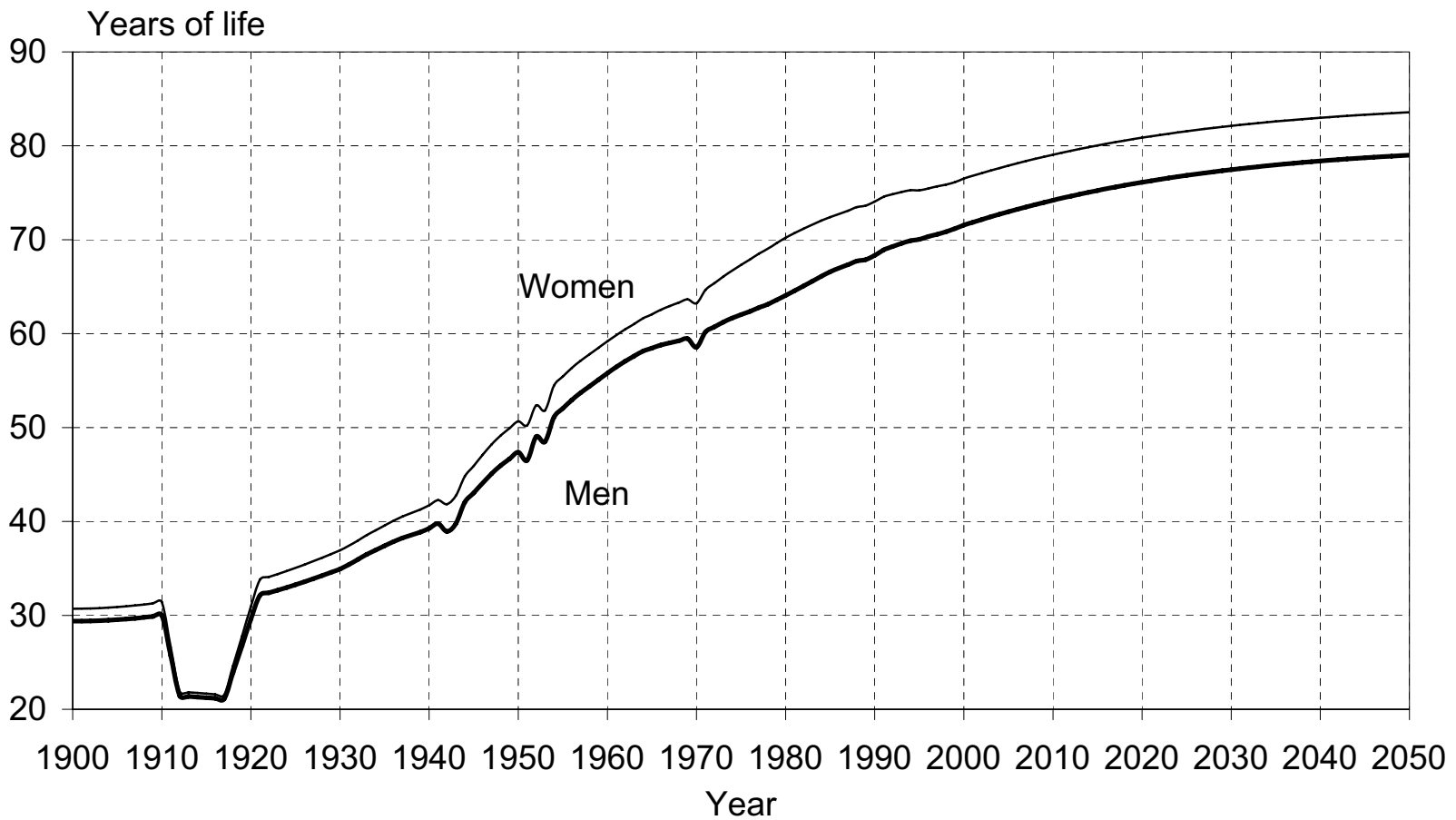

Figure 2. Total population and natural and total growth rates, Mexico, 1900-2050



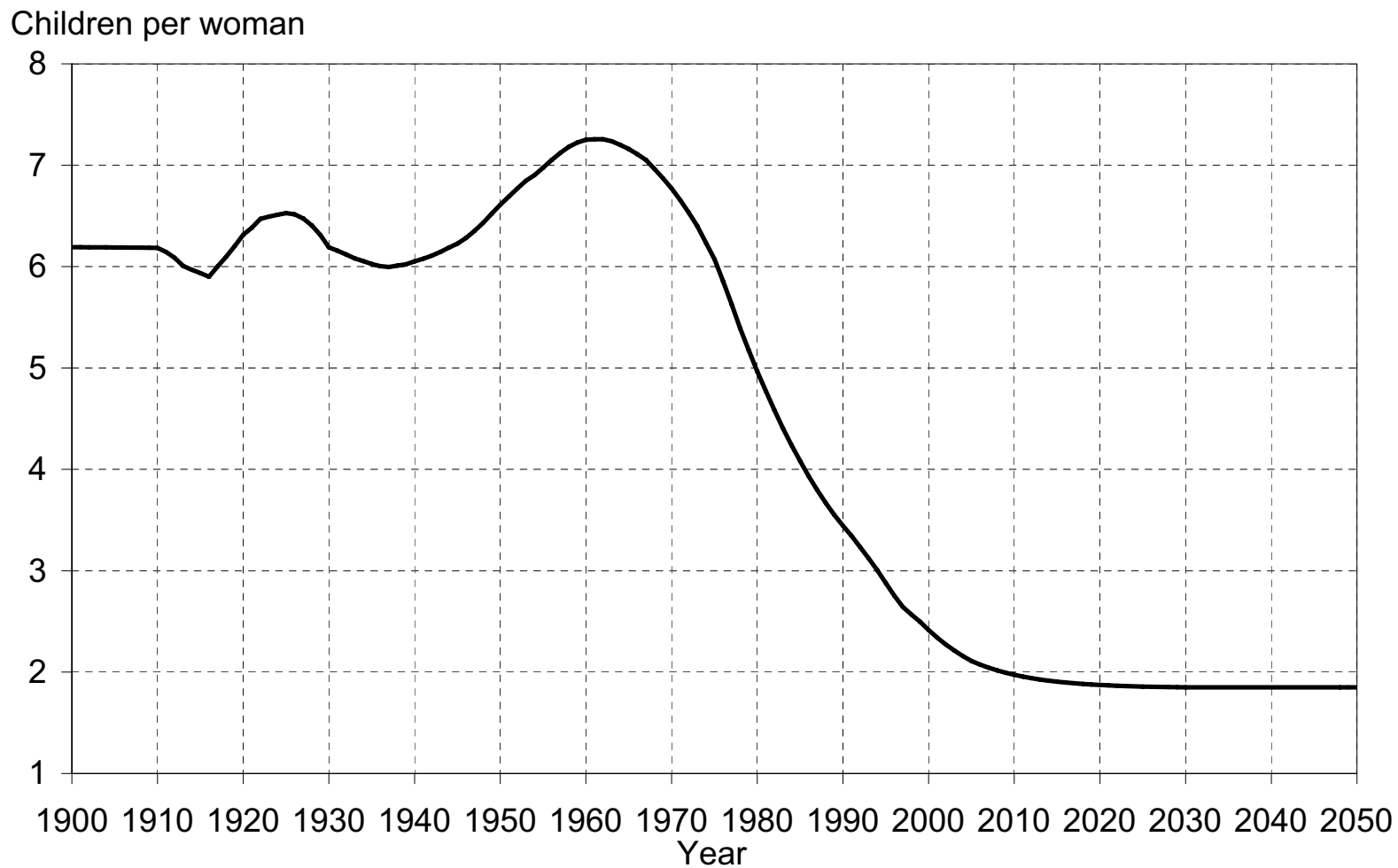

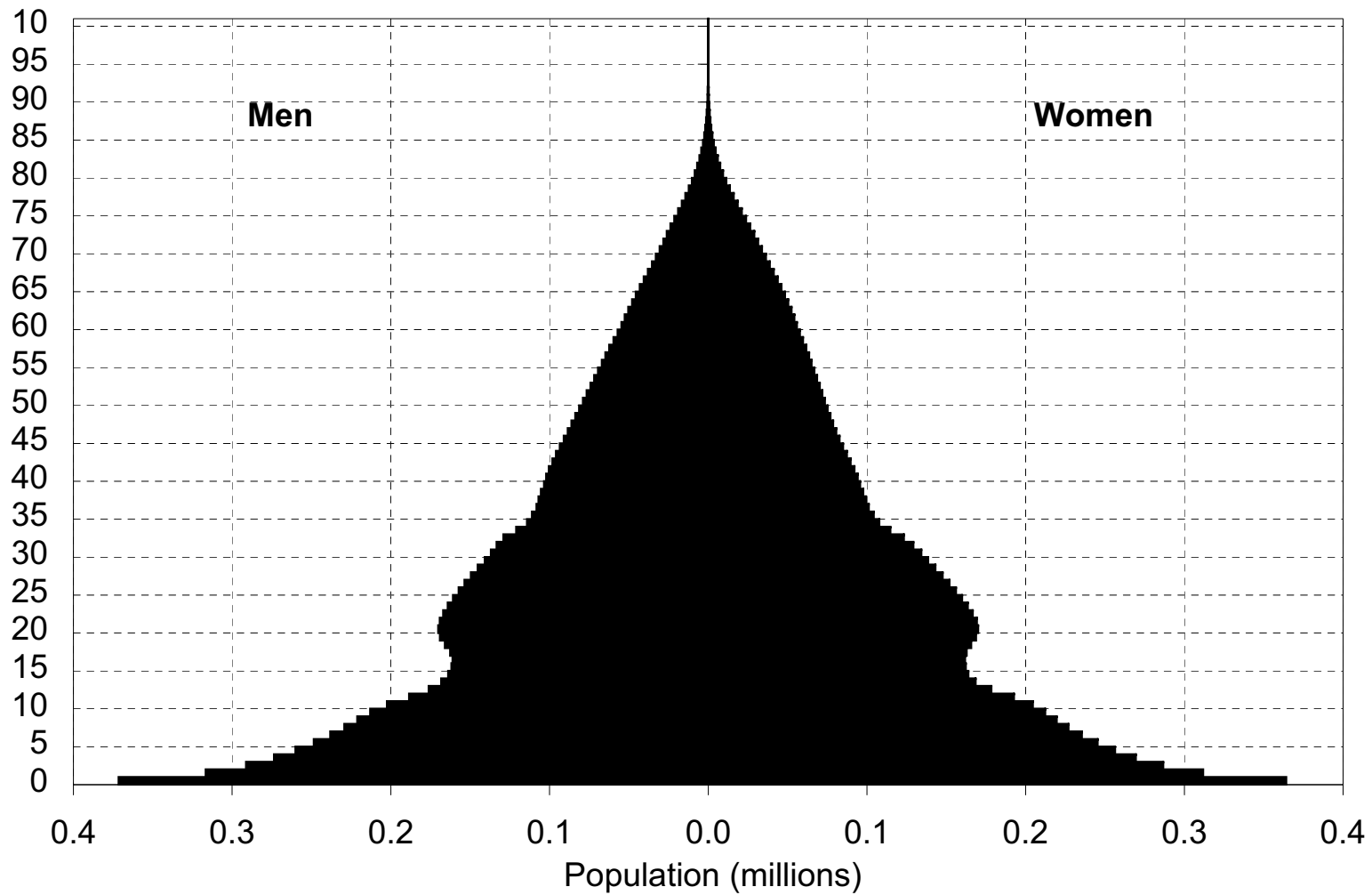
Figure 4. Total fertility rate, Mexico, 1900-2050

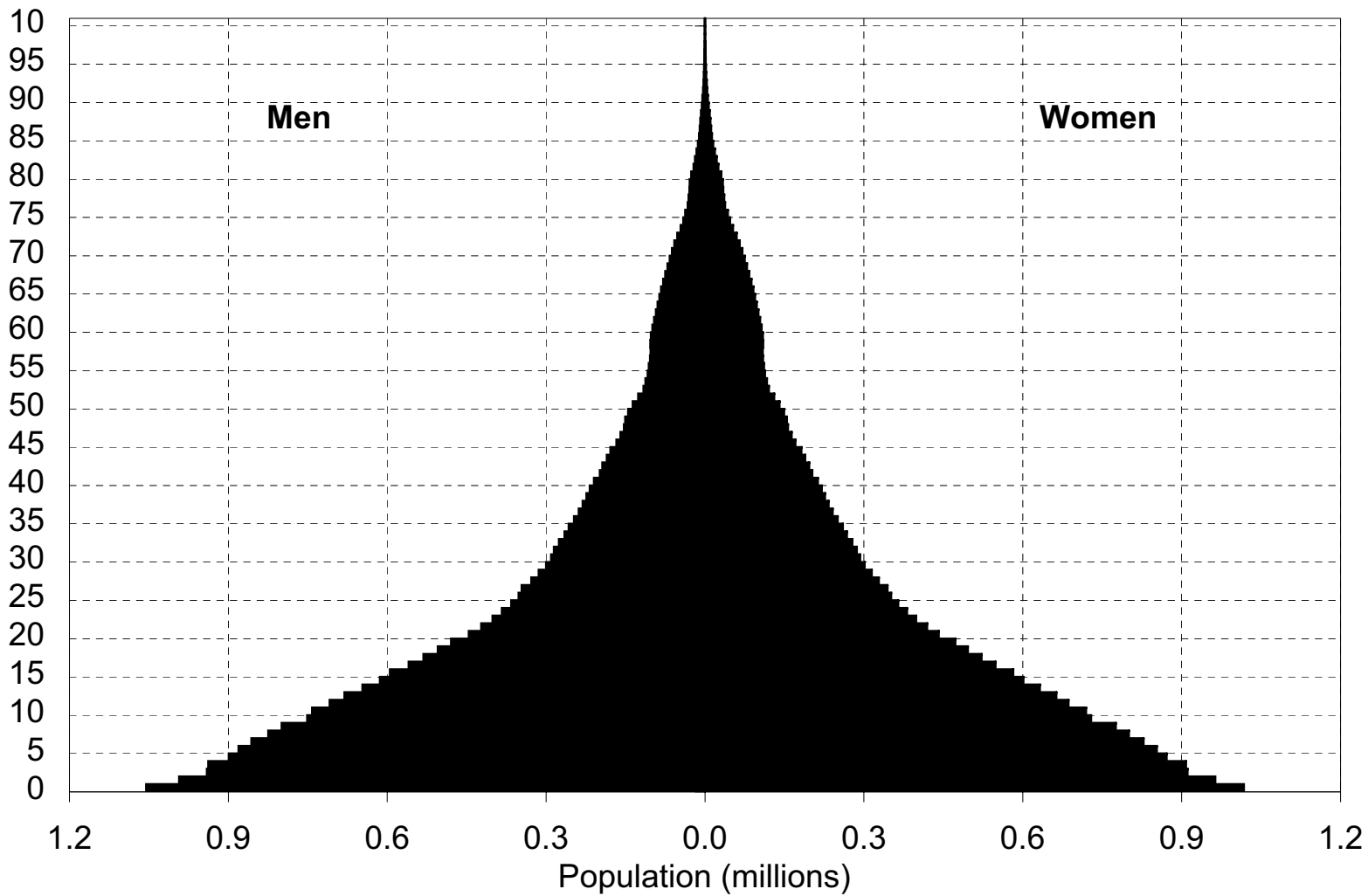

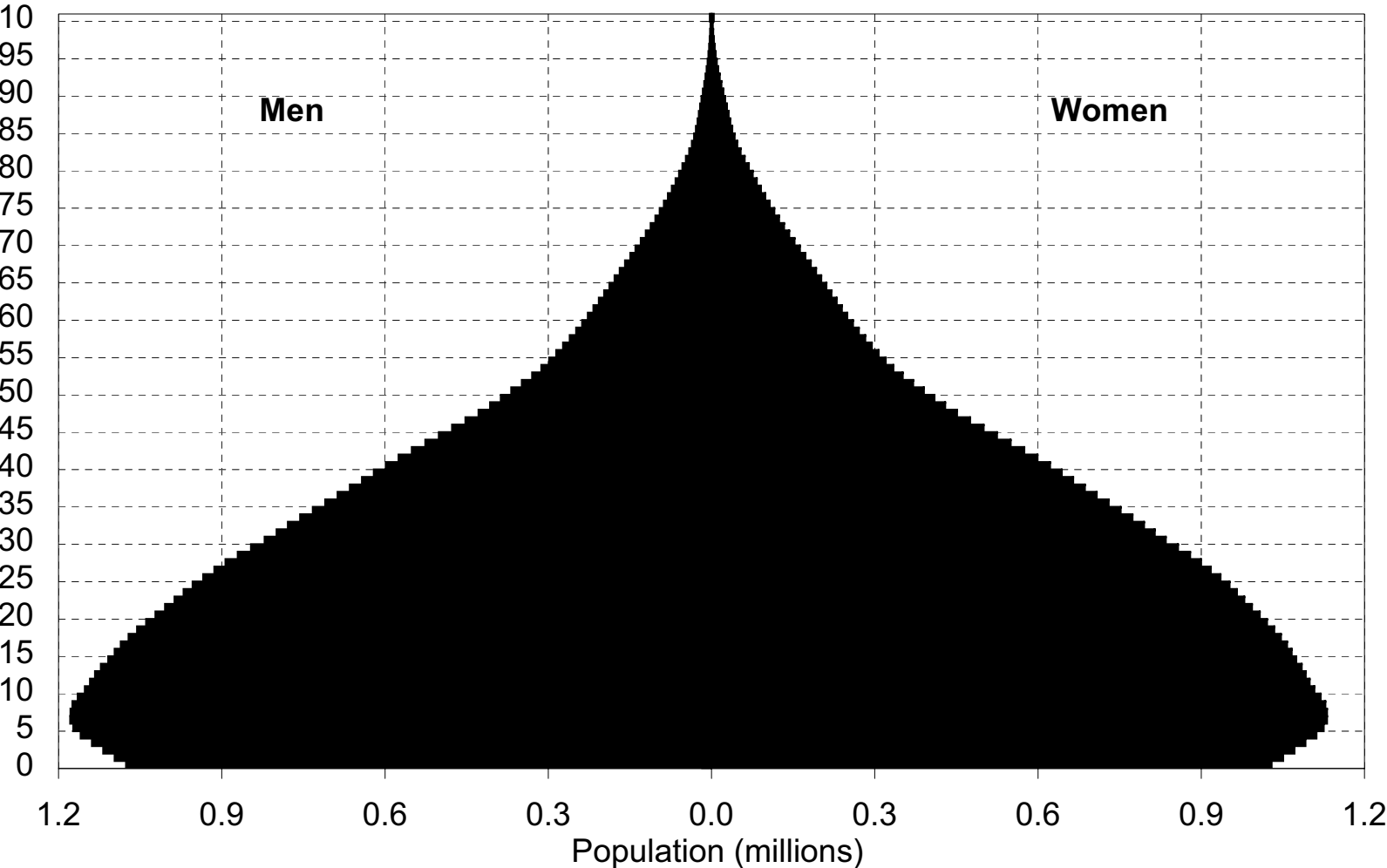

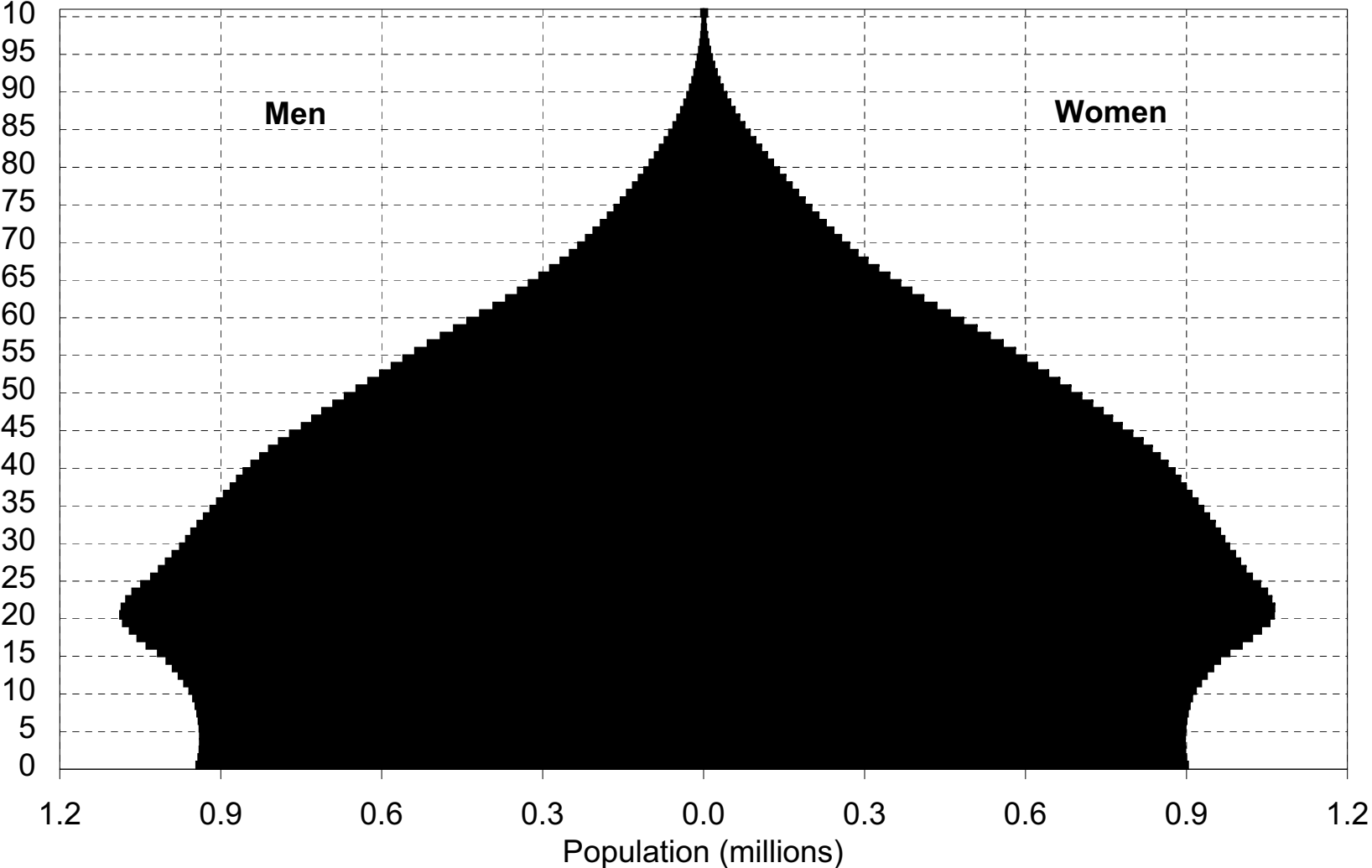

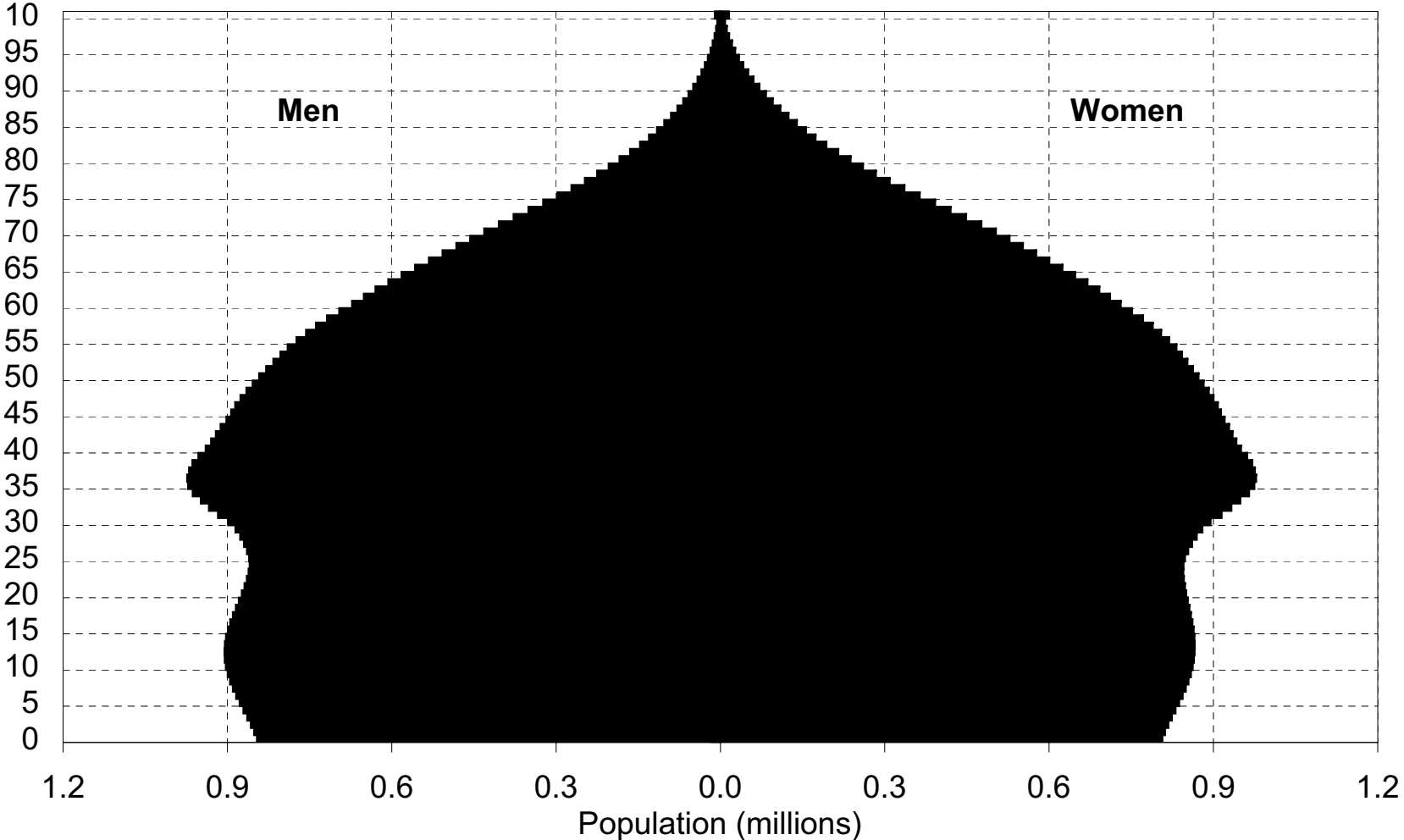

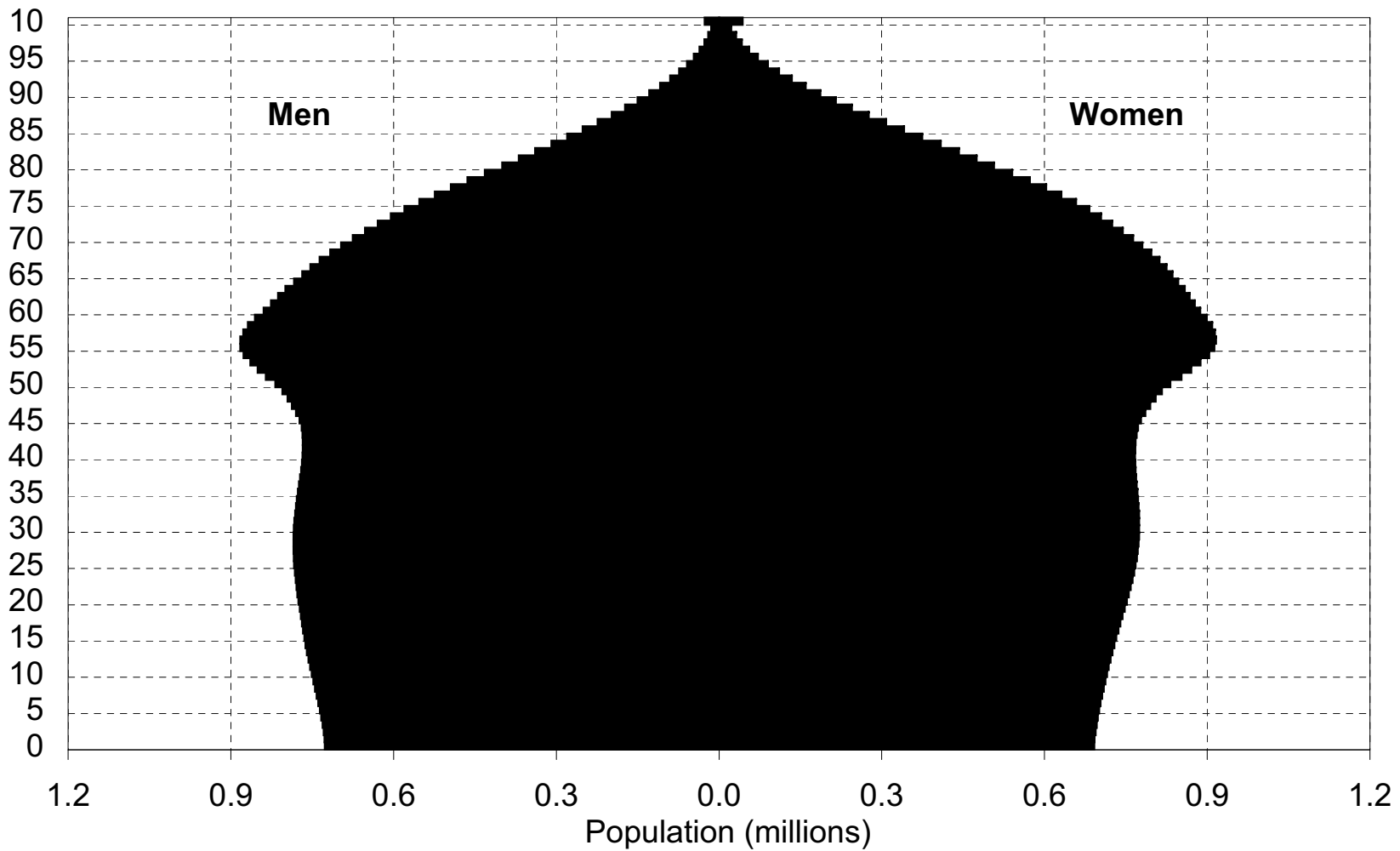

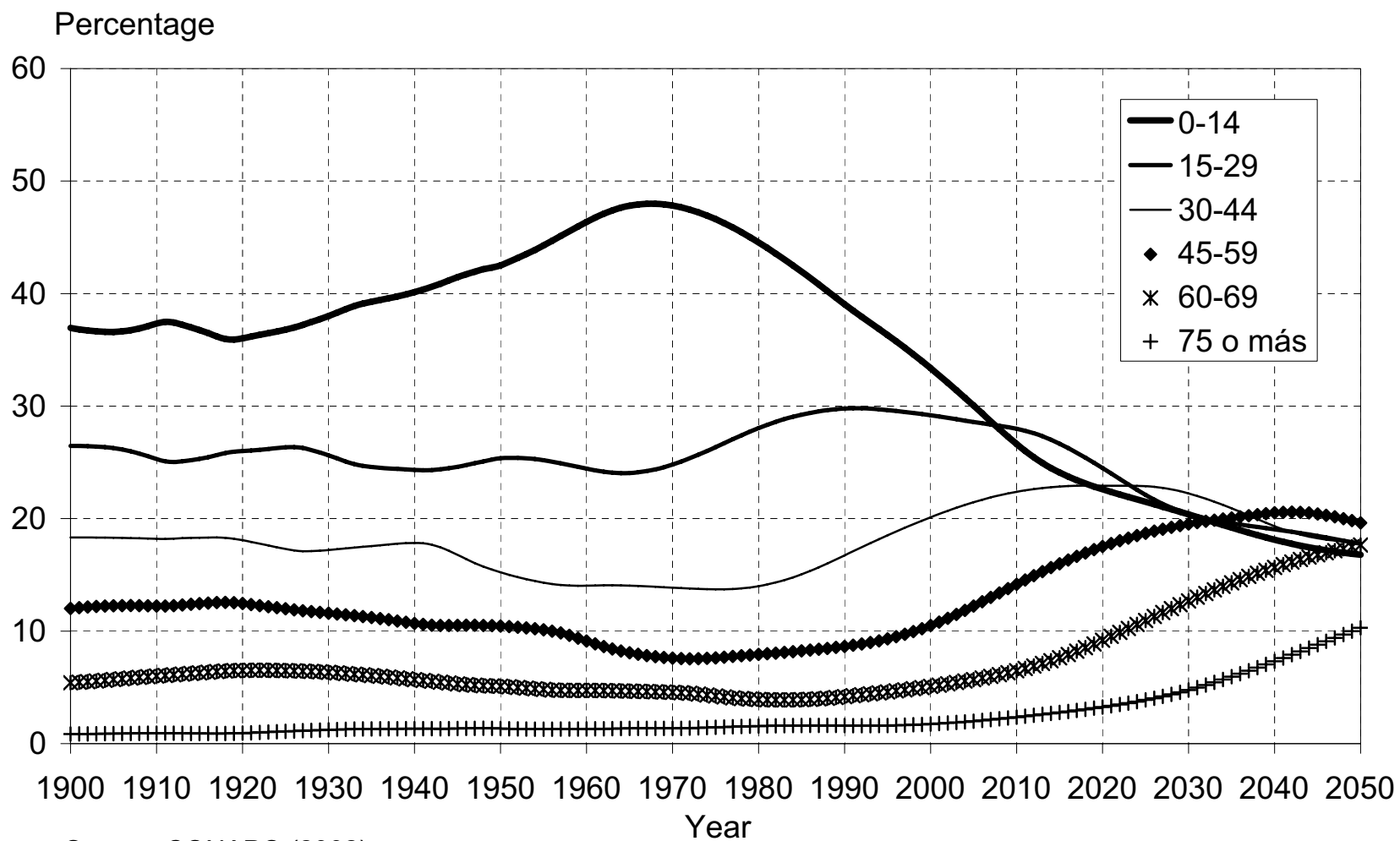

Figure 7.1. Impact of cohort flows on selected age groups, Mexico, 1900-2050

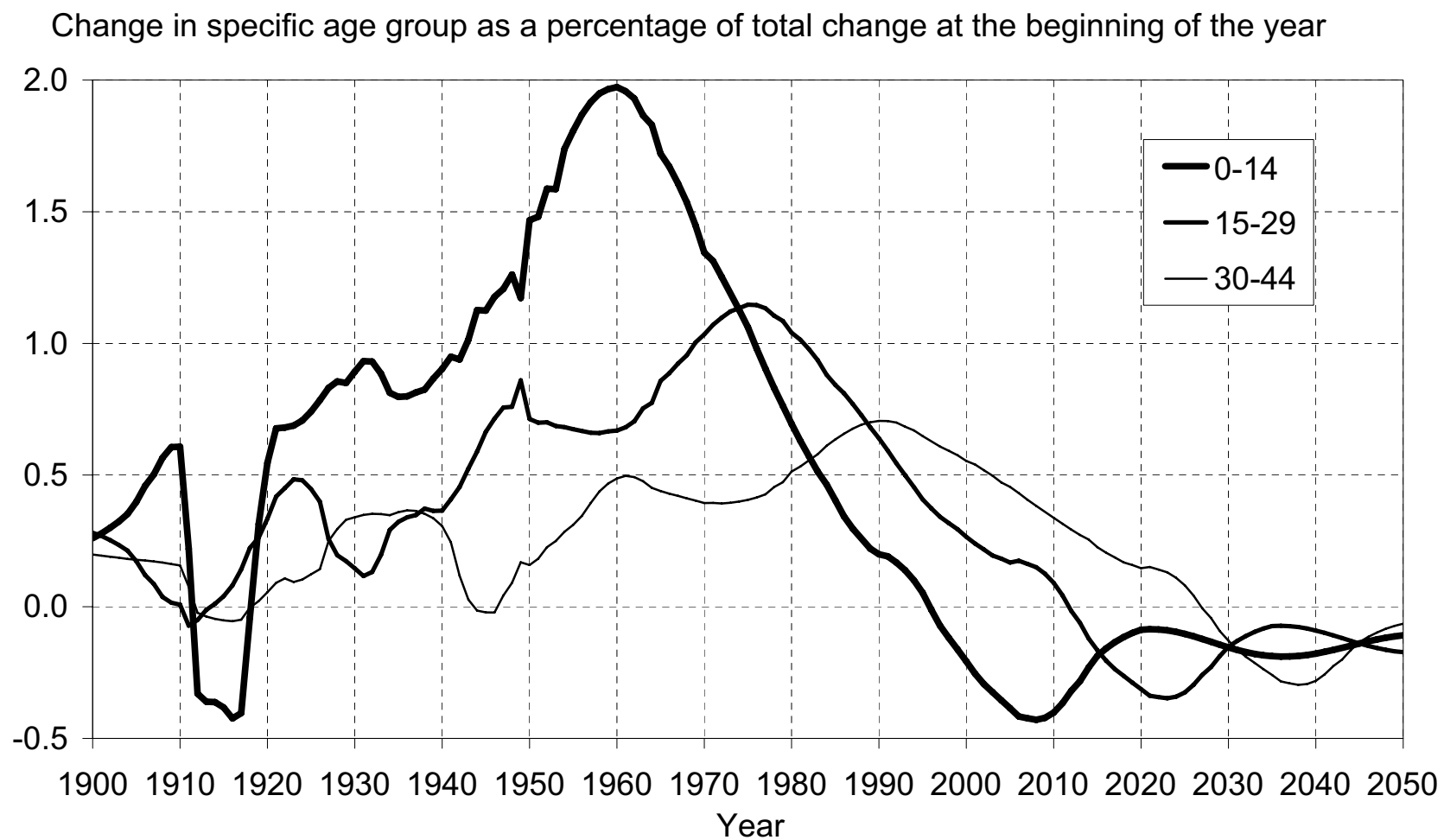
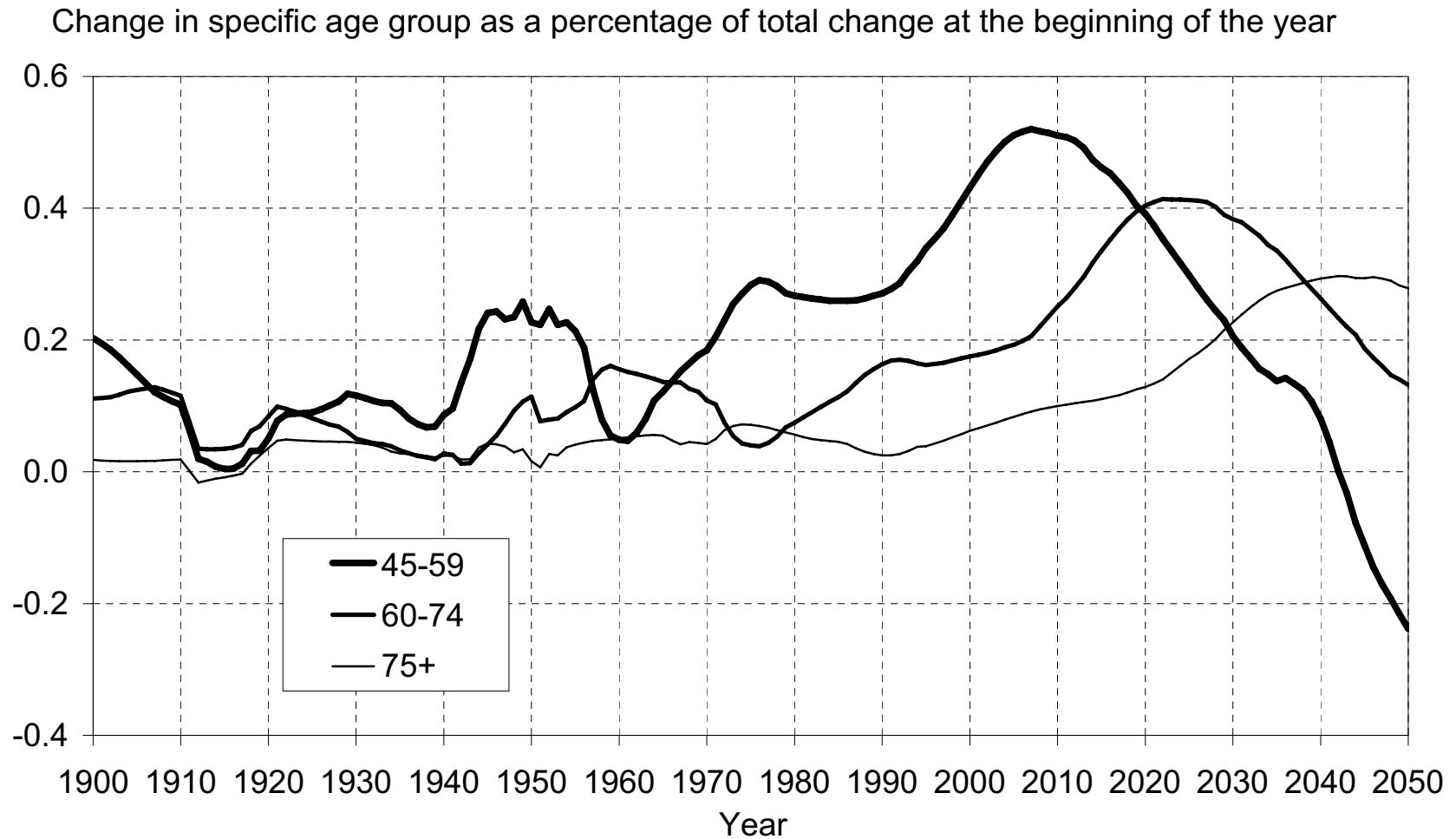
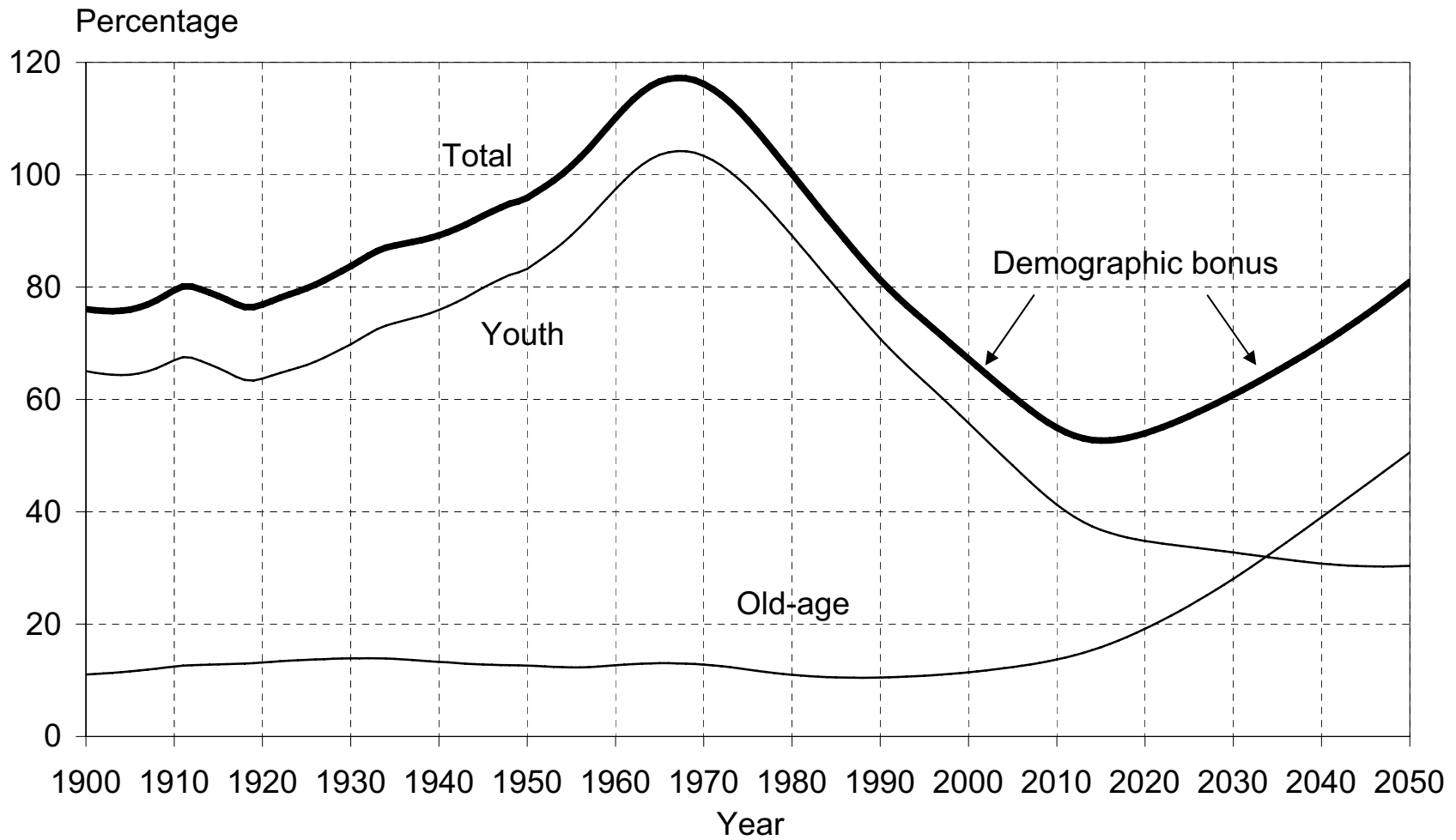


Figure 7.2. Impact of cohort flows on selected age groups, Mexico, 1900-2050

Figure 9. Population pyramids, Mexico, 2006 and 2029

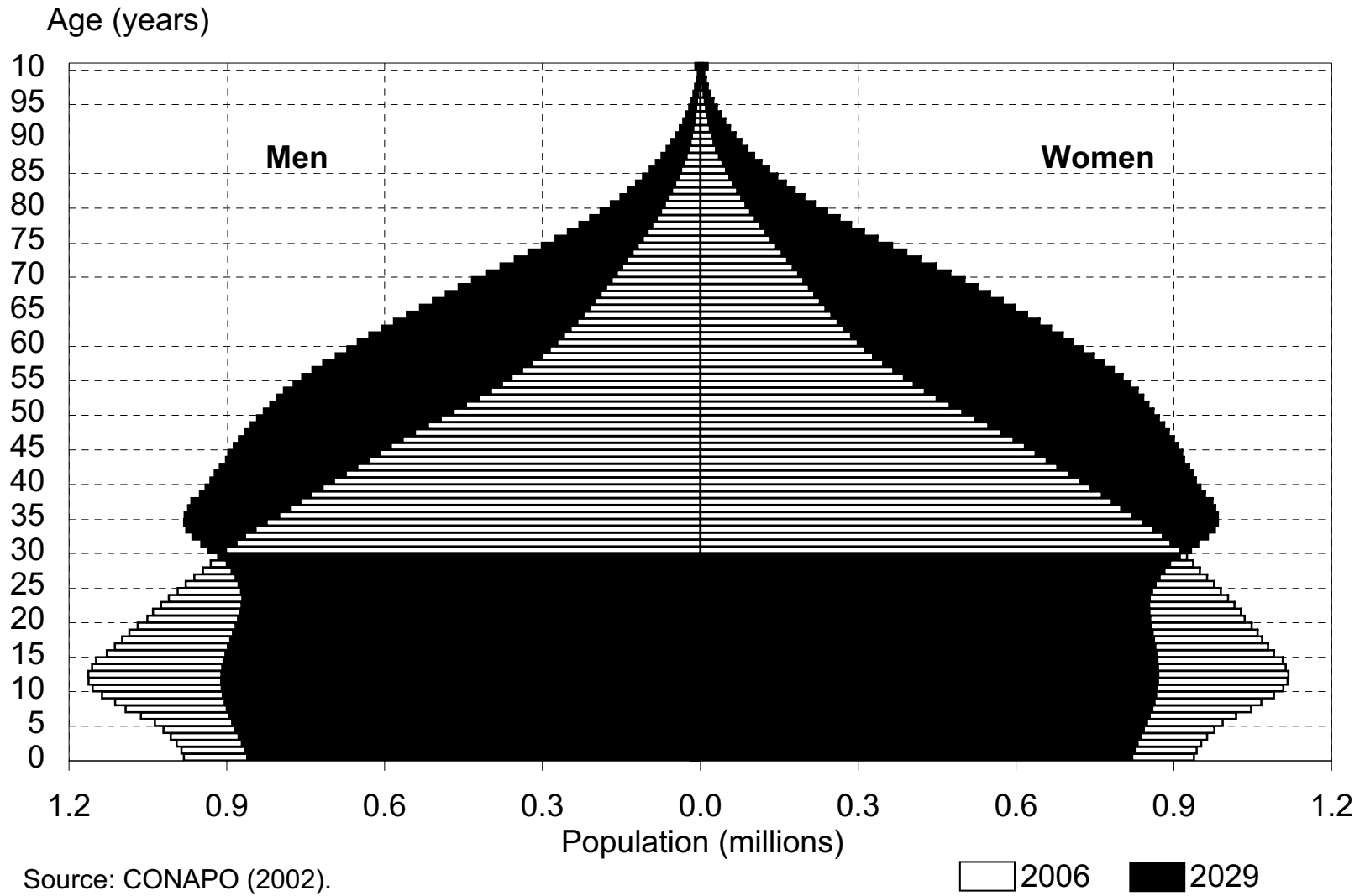
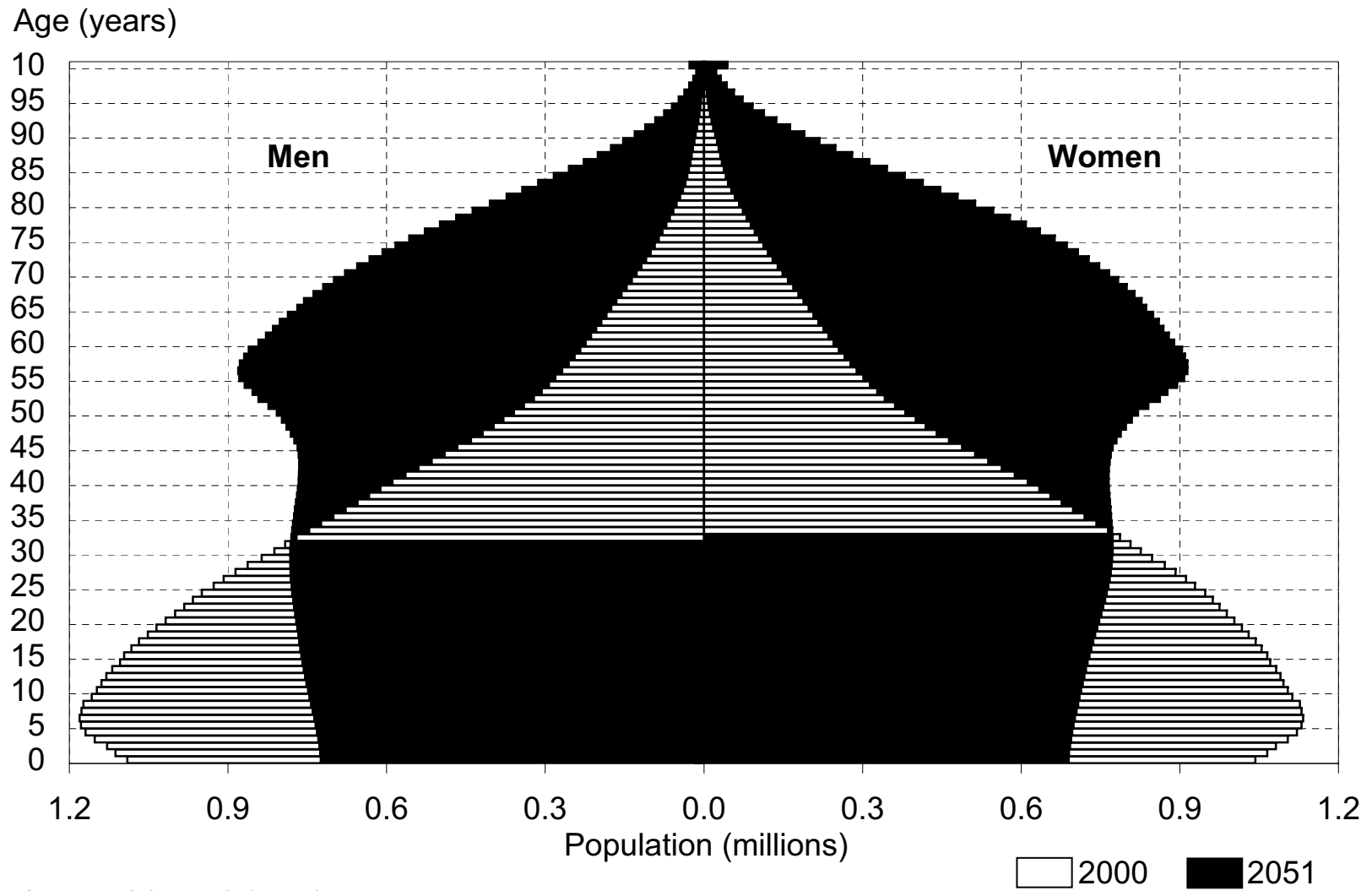
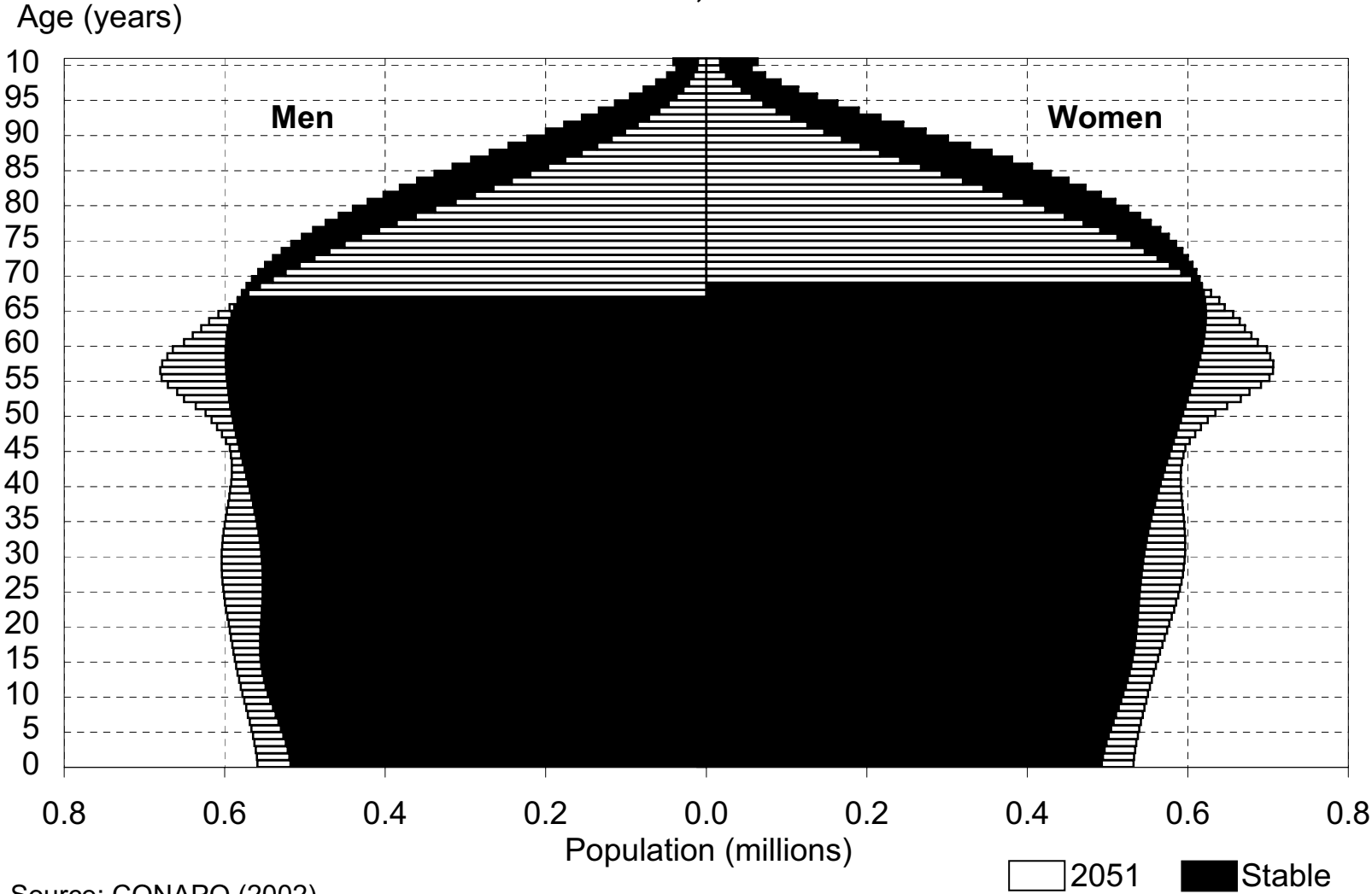


Figure 10. Population pyramids, Mexico, 2000 and 2051
