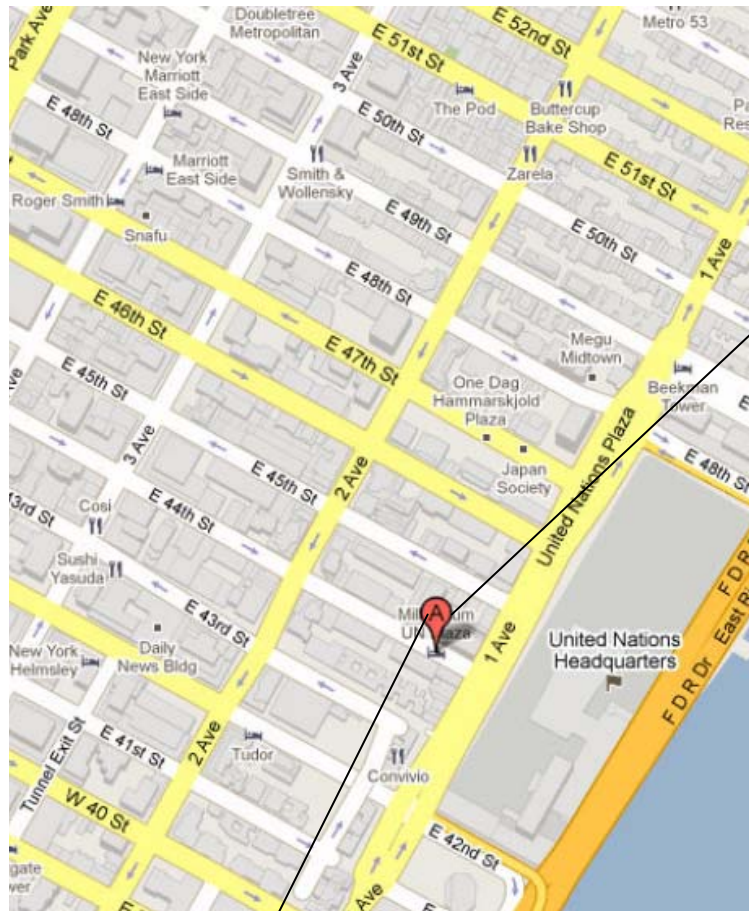
### **Time and venue of the meeting**

The Meeting will take place in the Manhattan conference room of the Millennium Plaza Hotel (1 United Nations Plaza, New York, NY), located next to the DC2 Building (2 United Nations Plaza) on the corner of 44<sup>th</sup> Street and 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue, from 09:00 am to 12:30 pm and from 2:00 pm to 5:00 pm.

### **New Temporary passes for non-United Nations participants**

All participants can access to the Millennium Plaza Hotel without a pass. However, if participants wish to enter a United Nations building, they are required to have a valid grounds pass. If you have a valid United Nations grounds pass or a United Nations Laissez Passer, please bring either or both in order to enter the United Nations. A temporary grounds pass will be given to participants who are not United Nations staff members. Passes will be distributed from 08:30 am to 09:00 am at the sign-in desk in front of the Manhattan conference room at the Millennium Hotel.
