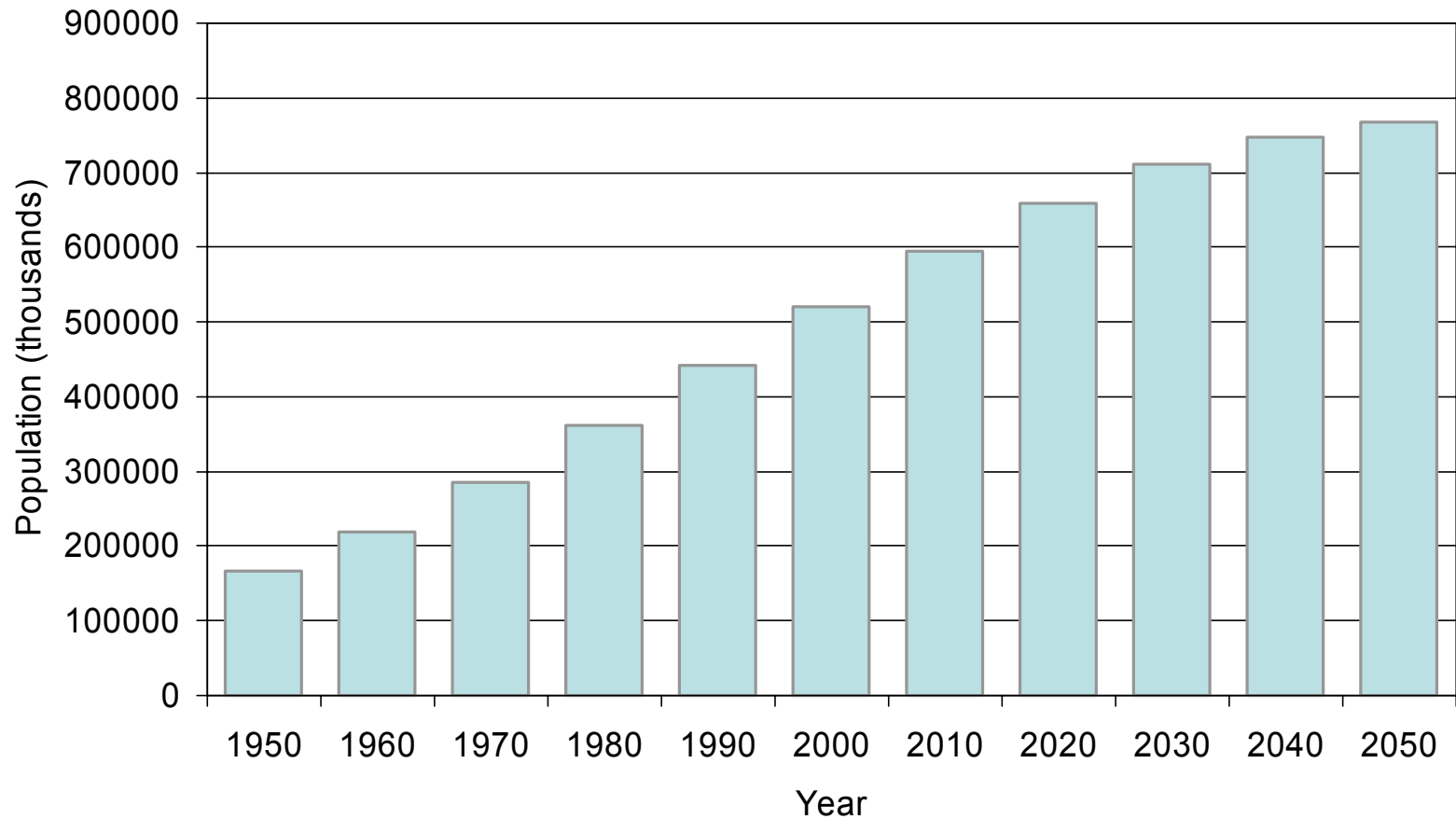

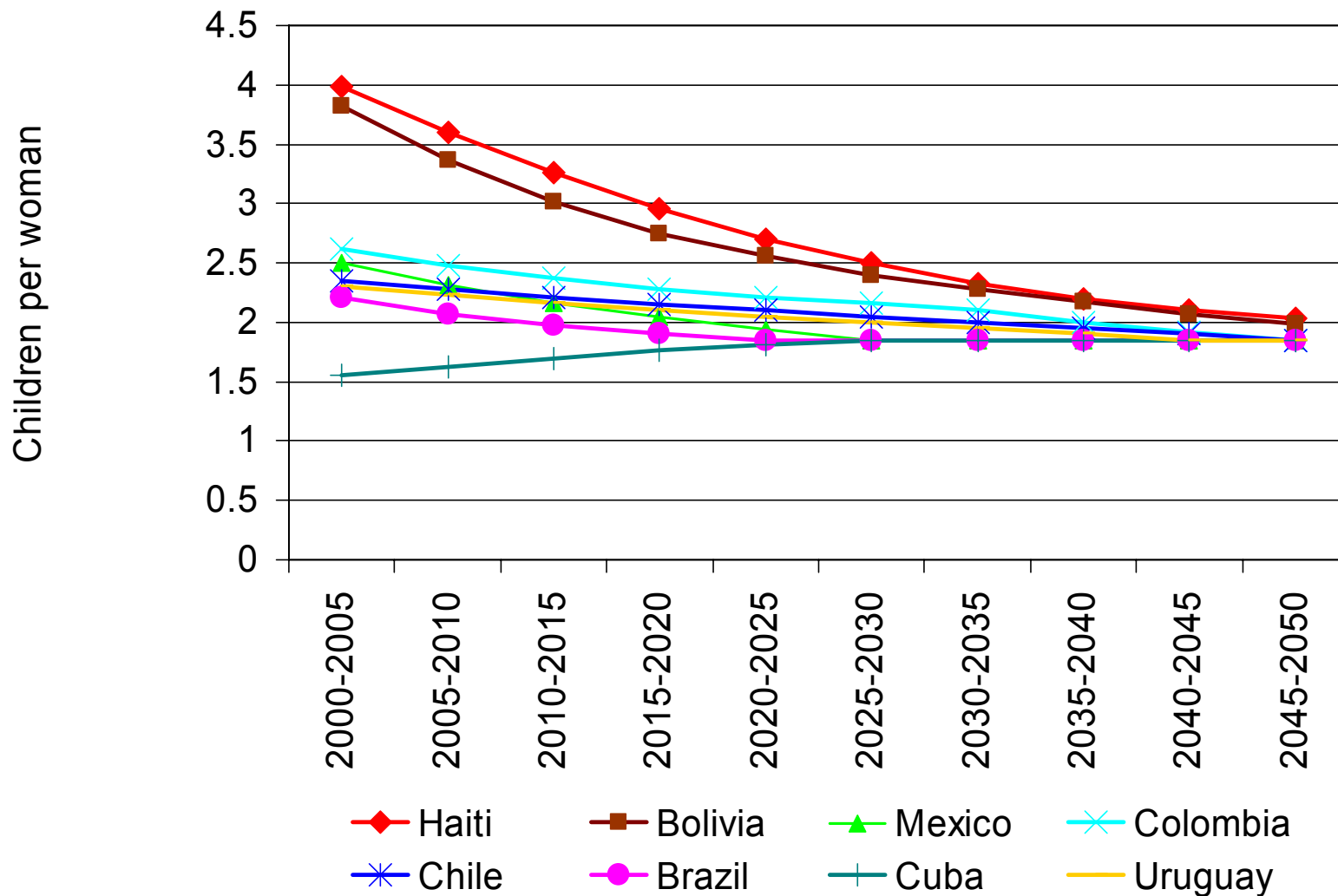

Latin American and Caribbean Population, 1950 - 2050



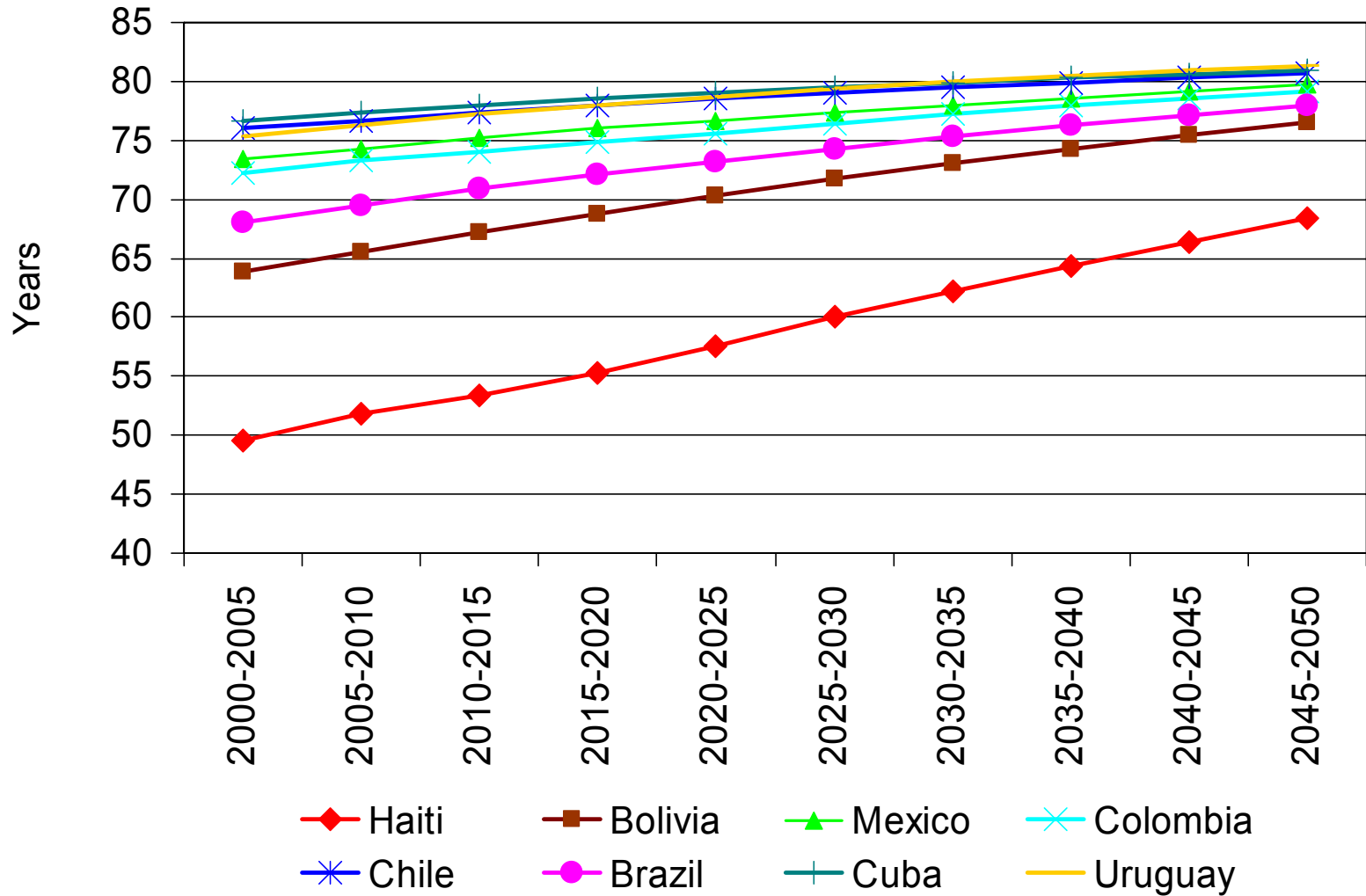

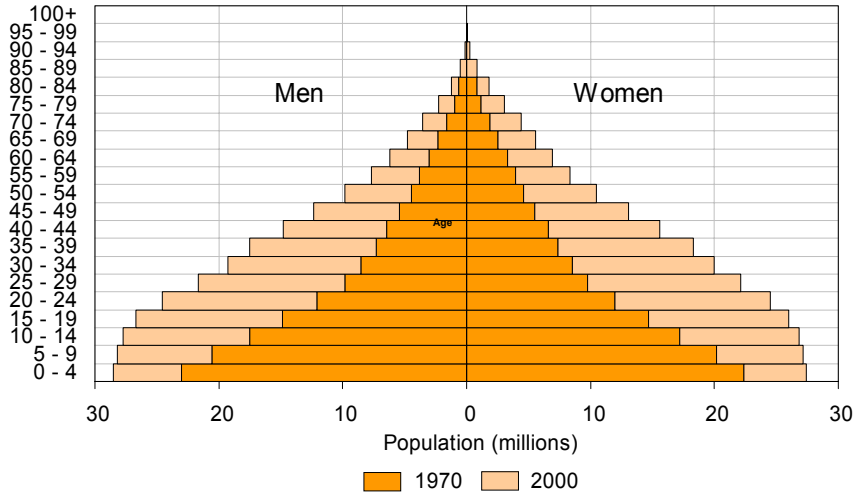
Life Expectancy at Birth of Selected Countries, 2000 - 2050



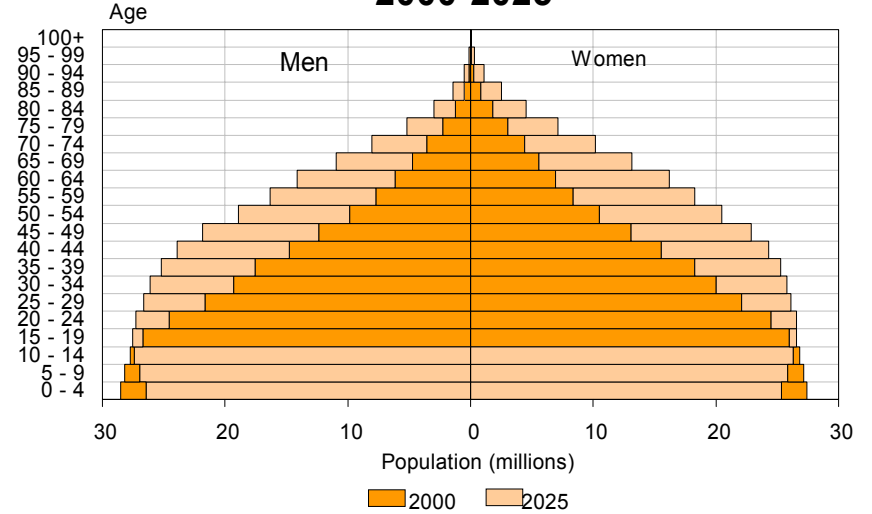

Population Pyramids of Latin America and the Caribbean, 1970-2050

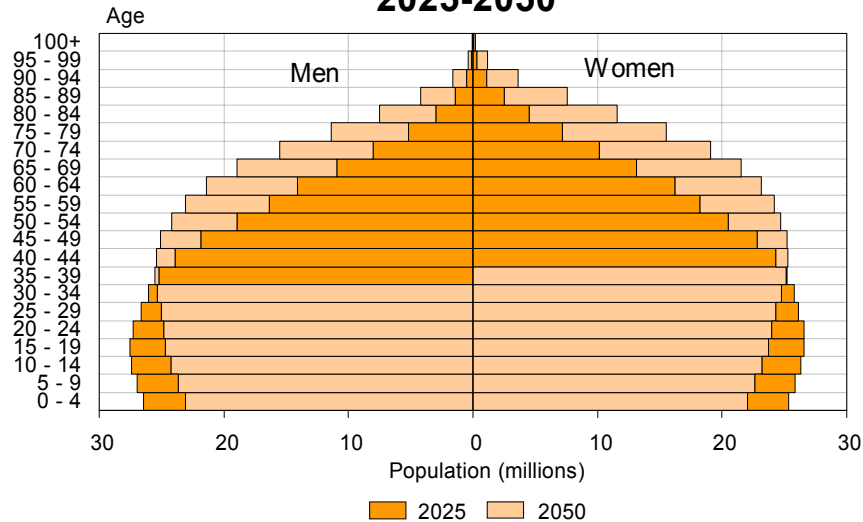

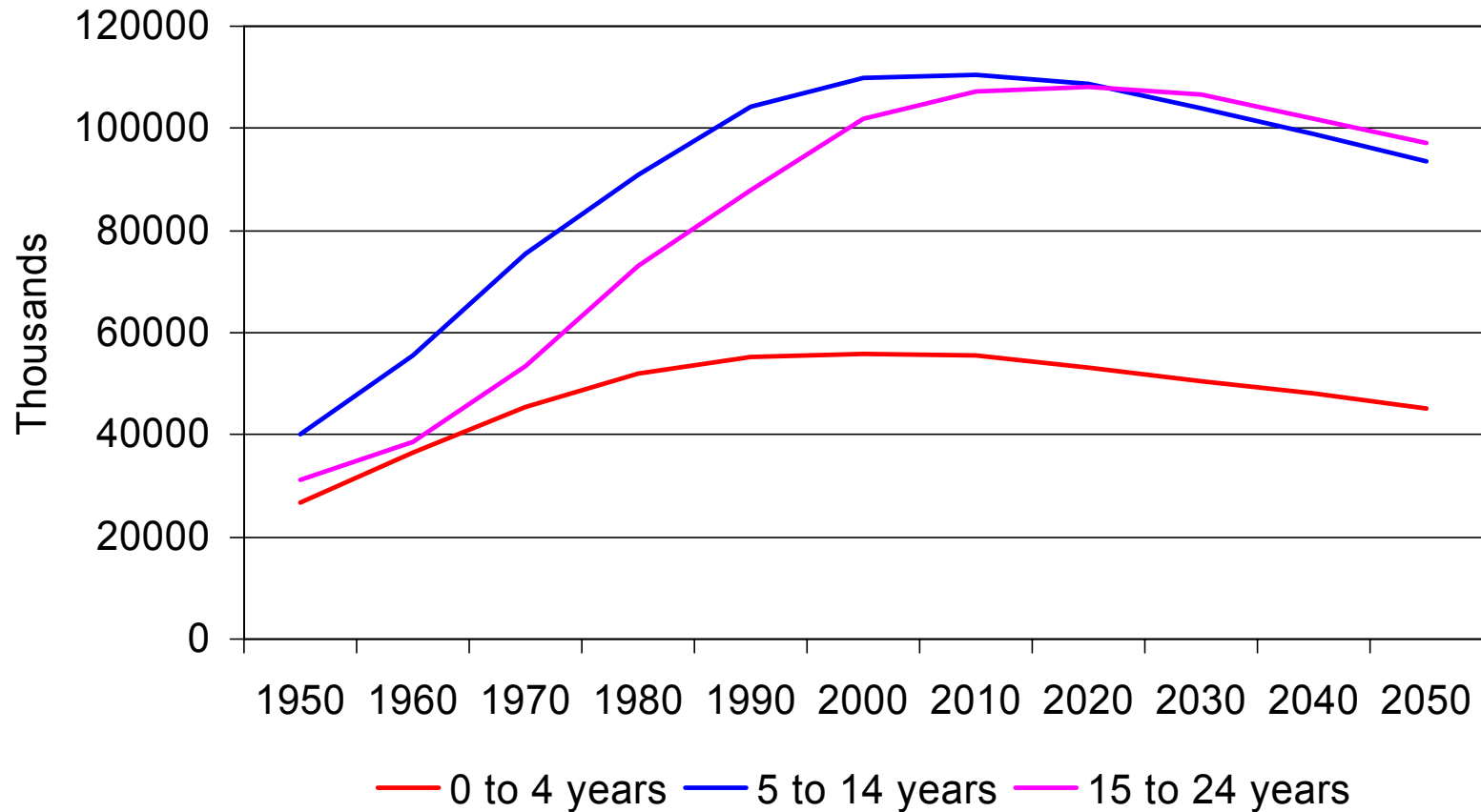

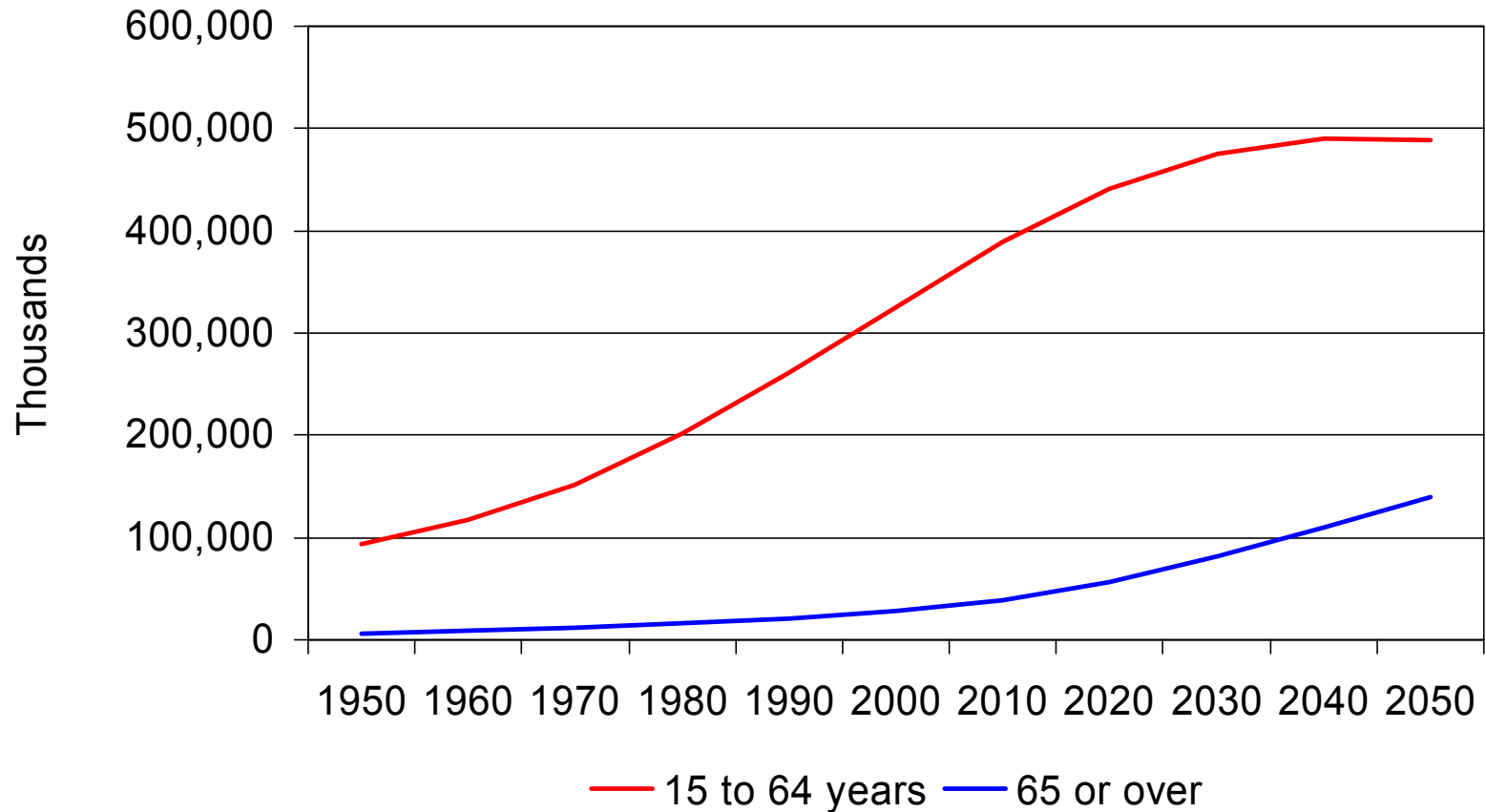

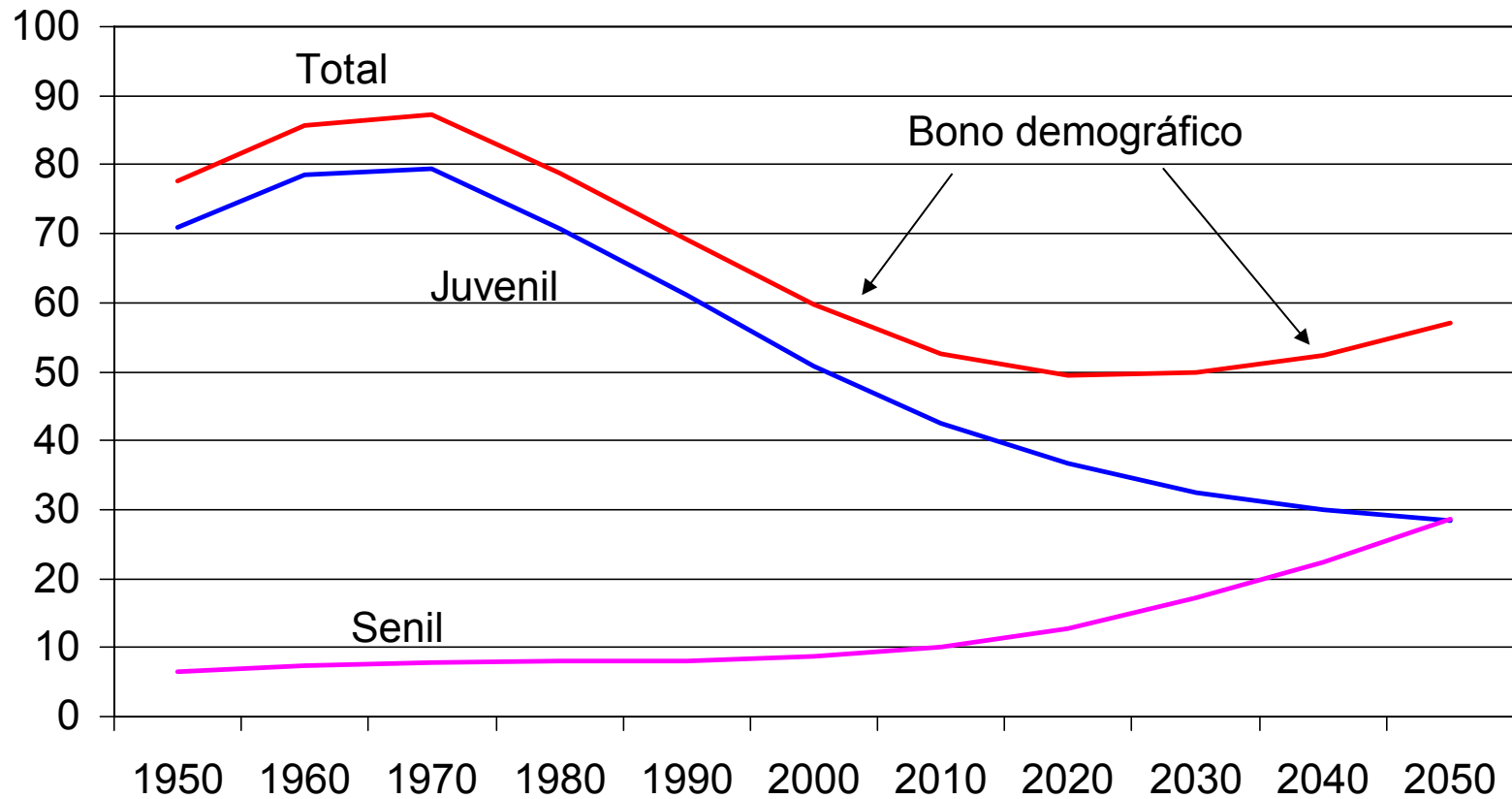
Evolution of Population of Latin America and the Caribbean, 1950 - 2050



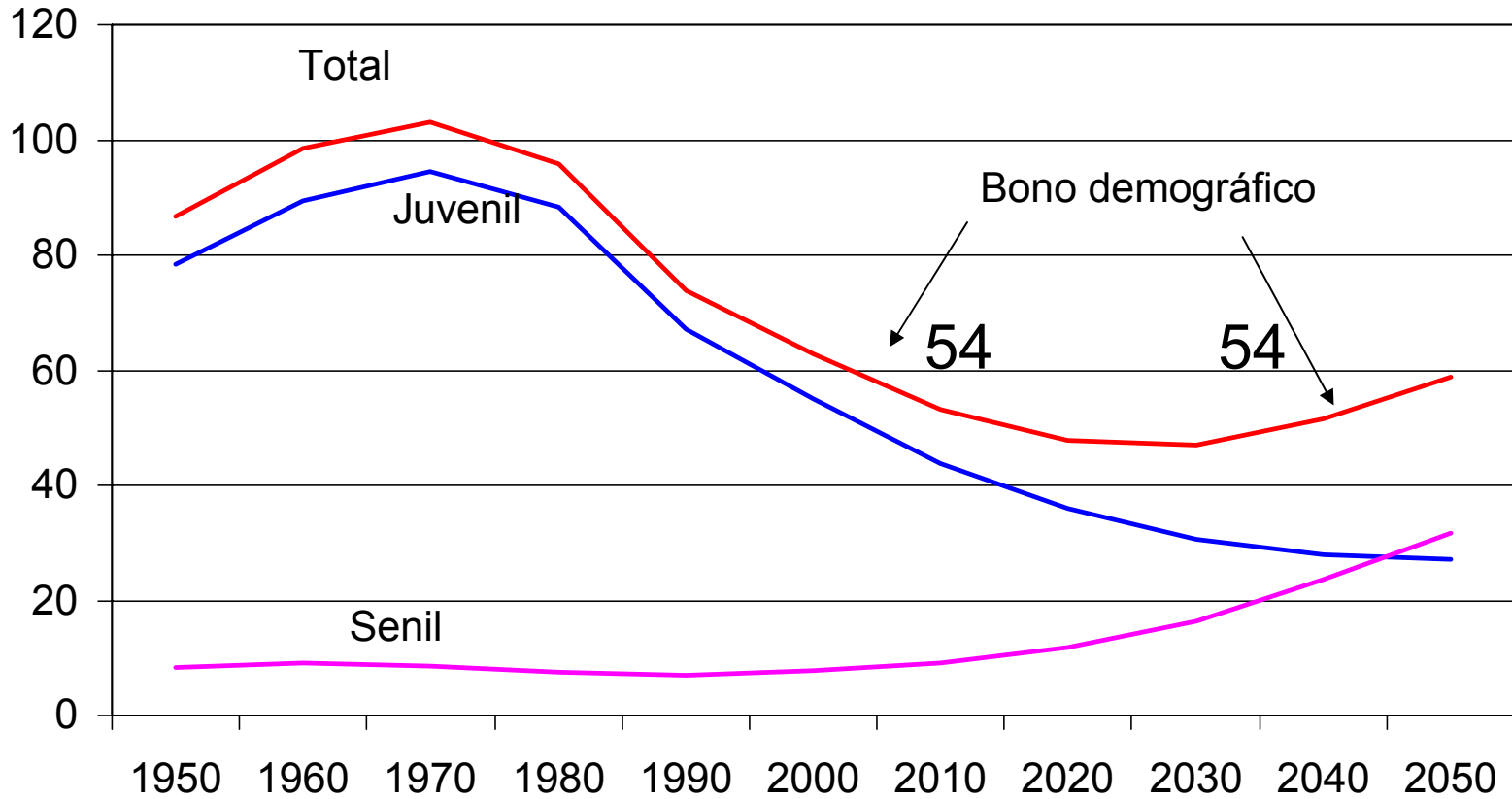
Evolution of the Population of Latin America and the Caribbean, 1950 - 2050

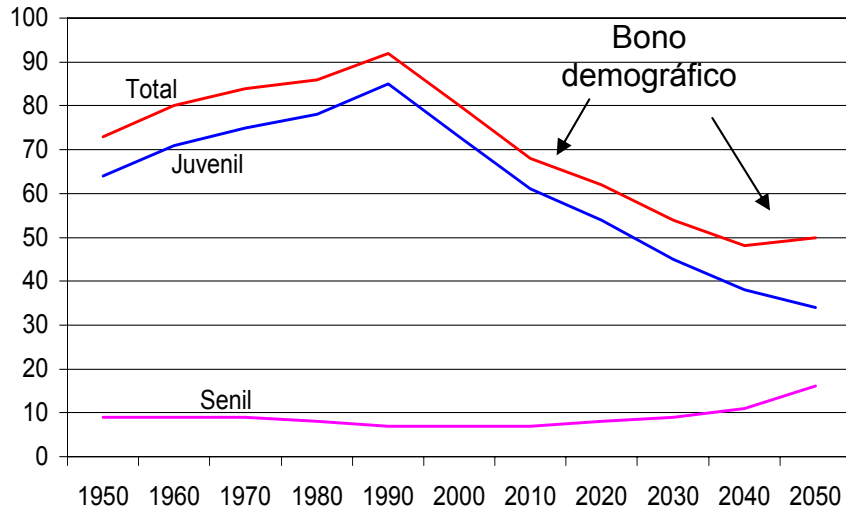

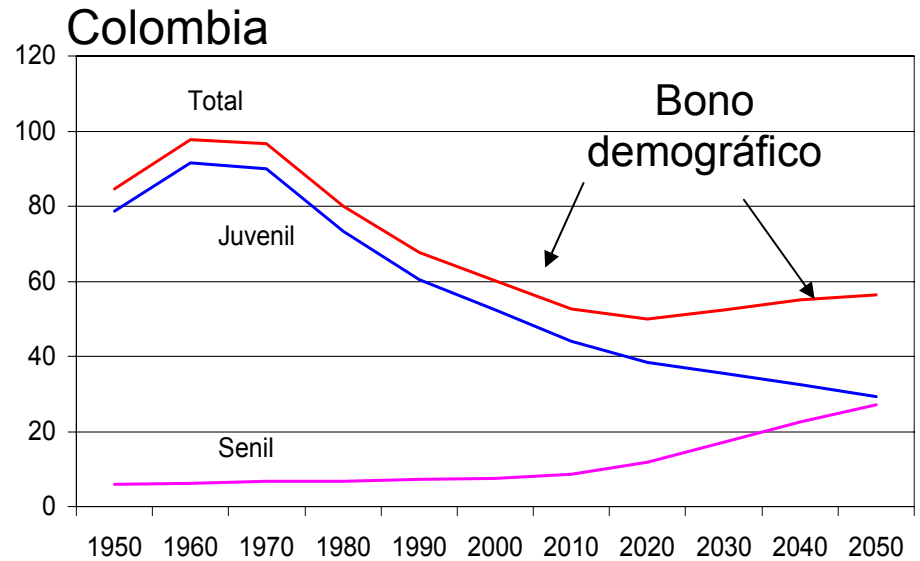
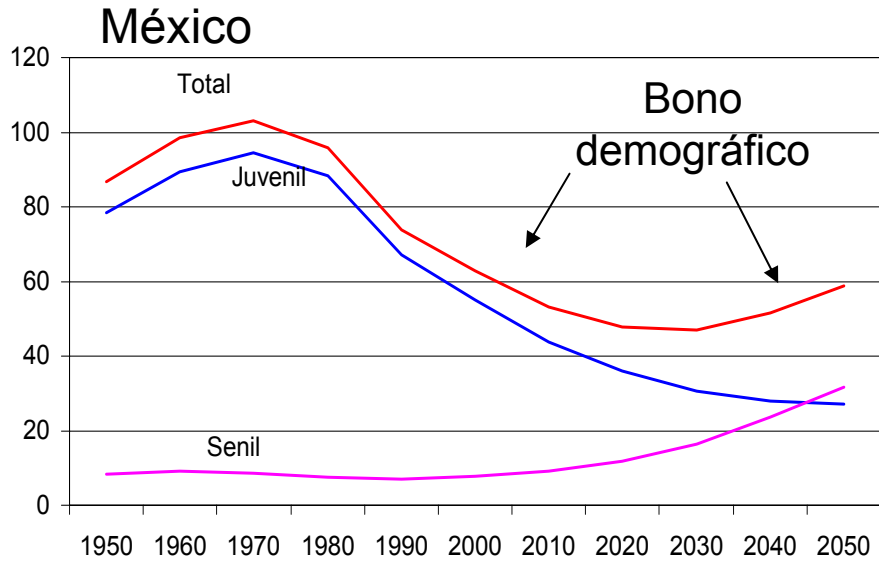

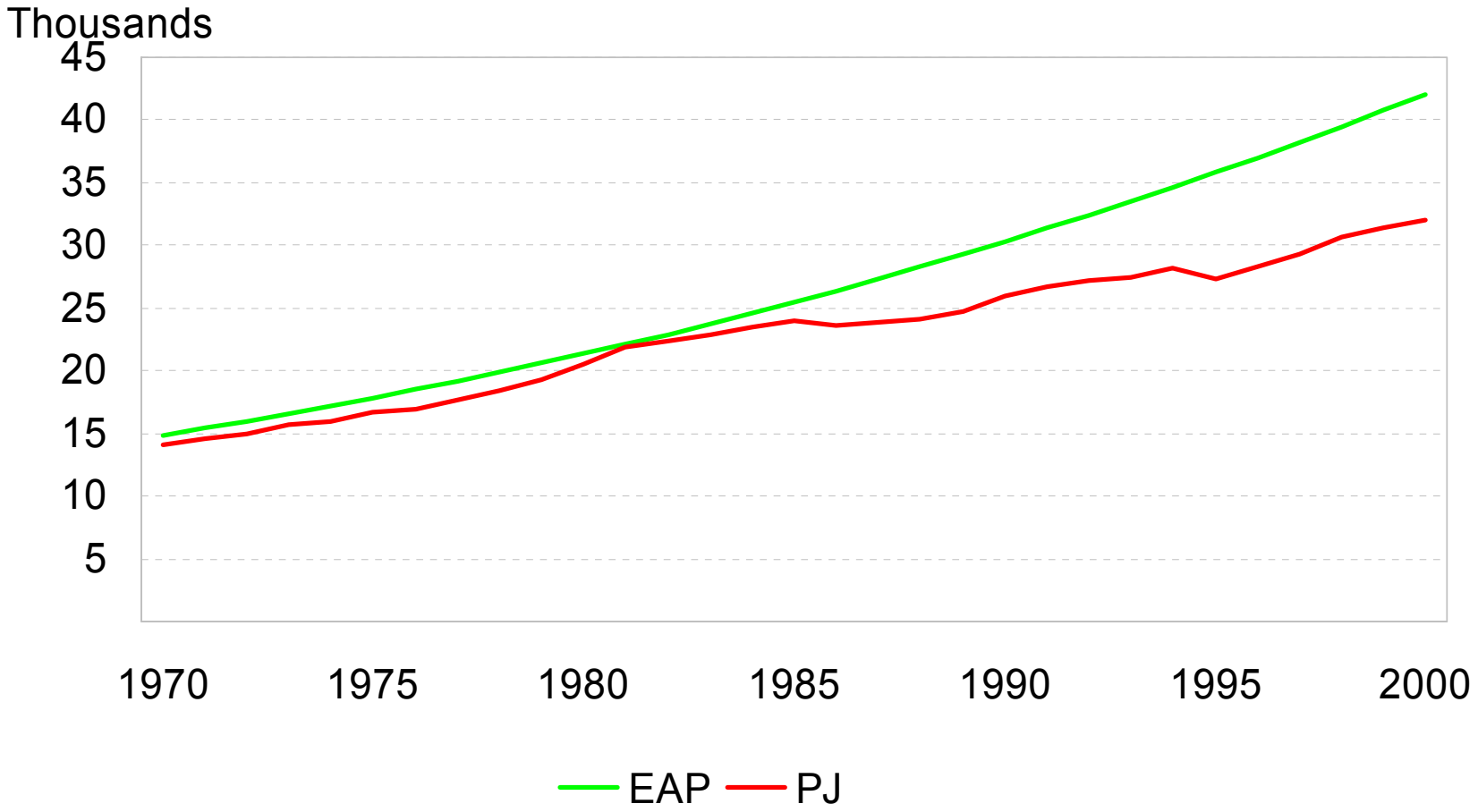

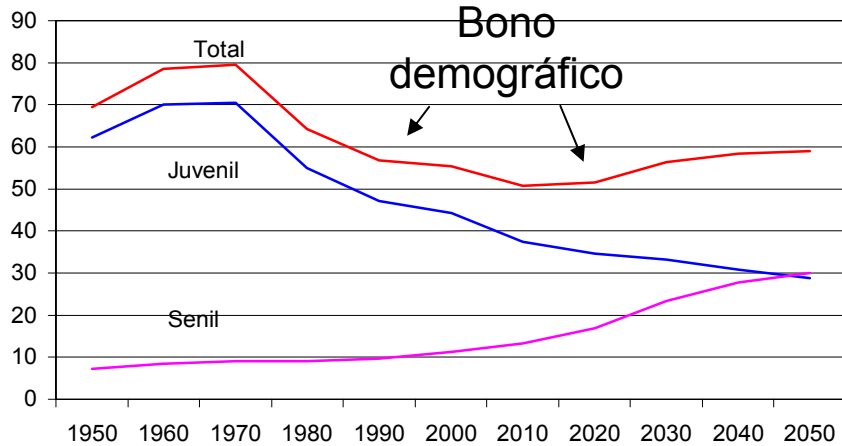
Mexico. Economically Active and Number of Paid Jobs by Prospective Scenarios, 1970-2000



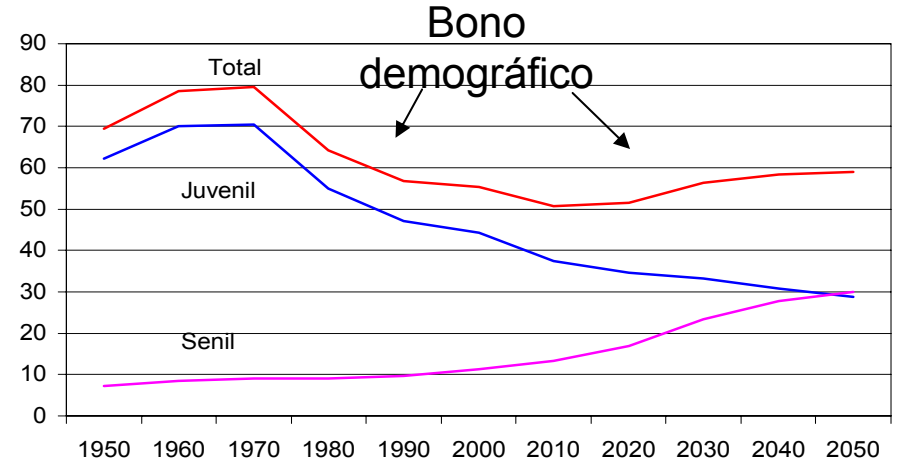

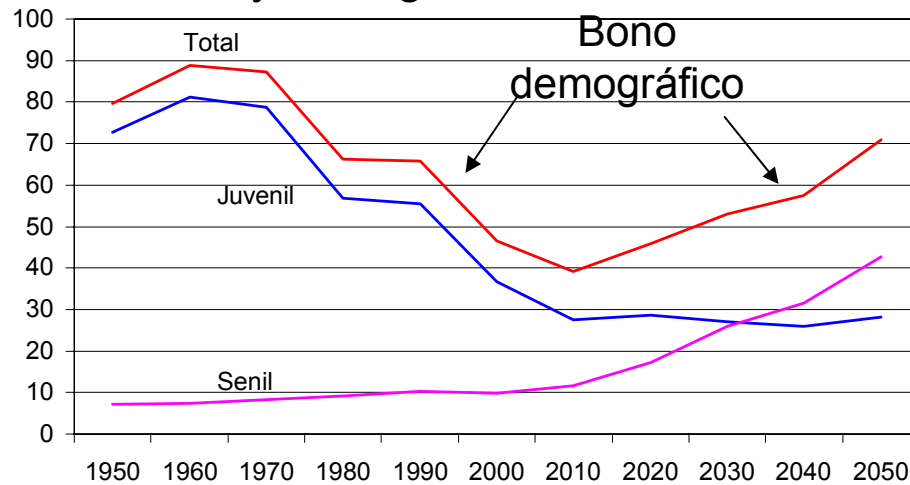
