
Marriage Patterns

POP/1/DB/2000/3

Contains data on marital status by age and sex for 206 countries or areas. The data are compiled from censuses and surveys since the 1960s. Each country file for a given date contains data for men and women separately, who have never married, married, in consensual unions, widowed, divorced and/or separated. For each of those marital categories, both absolute and relative (percentaged) data are displayed for 5- year age groups from 15 to 75 years and above. The data are in Microsoft Excel files.

National Population Policies, 2001

POP/DB/NPP/2001

Contains data on the population policies and policy perceptions of 193 countries around the dates 1976, 1986, 1996 and 2001. The data are drawn from information in the Population Policy Data Bank maintained by the Population Division. The policy topics covered include population growth, mortality, fertility, internal migration and spatial distribution, immigration and emigration. A graphic interface allows a user-friendly search of the database. Also contains information on related demographic socio-economic indicators as well as an electronic version of the two-page country sheets published in *National Population Policies, 2001* (ST/ESA/SER.R/156). The Population, Resources, Environment and Development databank (PredBank Version 3.0) is the latest version of the database on population

trends and socio-economic and development indicators published by the Population Division. It consists of 131 variables dealing with data on population trends and policies, labour force, education, economic and social development, land water and energy use. It also provides an overview of selected international treaties and conventions related to major environment and development issues. The databank is available on CD-ROM.

Contains time series data on flows and stocks on international migration from and to Eastern Europe, all successor states of the former USSR, Albania, and all successor states of the former Yugoslavia. To the extent possible, the data presented cover the period 1980-2000. Available in EXCEL

Trends in Total Migrant Stock by Sex

POP/1B/DB/98/4

Contains estimates of the number of international migrants in each country or area of the world as of 1965, 1975, 1985, and 1990, classified by sex. It also includes a number of indicators relative to the migrant stock, such as, the proportion of international migrants among the total population of each country or area, and the growth rate of the migrant stock over specific periods. Available as an EXCEL workbook.

South-to-North International Migration Database

POP/DB/MIG/2001/2

Contains statistics on annual international migration flows to Australia, Belgium, Canada, Germany, the Netherlands, Sweden, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America, covering, in most cases, the period 1960-2000 and classified by country of origin. Estimates of South-to-North migration, as well as East-to-West migration are included. Available in EXCEL.

The Components of Urban Growth

POP/1B/DB/95/3

Contains estimates of net rural-urban migration for selected countries of Africa, Asia and Latin America derived from intercensal comparisons. Estimates of the natural increase of urban populations are also included, thus permitting an assessment of the components of urban growth. To the extent possible, the estimates cover three periods: 1960-1970, 1970-1980 and 1980-1990. Available in EXCEL.

Mortality in Childhood

POP/DB/MORT/2001/1,2,3)

Contains estimates of infant, child and under five mortality for countries in Africa (2001/1), Asia (2001/2) and Latin America (2001/3). Estimates cover the period 1965-2000 and are derived from a variety of sources, including censuses, surveys and vital registration data. For each country represented in the database, five worksheets present information, if available, on (a) available data sources, (b) estimates of mortality for both sexes combined, (c) estimates of mortality for

males and females, (d) a plot of trends in under five mortality by sex, with a comparison to estimates from other United Nations sources, and (e) procedures used for estimates derived using indirect methods. All data are presented in EXCEL format with documentation in WORD 2000.

QFIVE: Microcomputer Program for Child Mortality Estimation

POP/SW/MOR/89

Has been prepared to accompany the Step-by-step Guide to the Estimation of Child Mortality. It produces estimates of infant mortality (the probability of dying between birth and exact age 1 ${}_1q_0$), child mortality (the probability of dying between the exact ages 1 and 5, ${}_4q_1$) and under-five mortality (the probability of dying between birth and exact age 5, ${}_5q_0$) by applying the two versions of the Brass method presented in the Guide: the Trussell version, which is based on the Coale-Demeny model life-tables and the Palloni-Heligman version based on the United Nations model life-tables for developing countries. QFIVE can run on an IBM-PC compatible microcomputer

equipped with MS-DOS, version 2.1 or later, and a random access memory of 300K or more. Available on one 5.25" diskette.

PDPM/PC: Population and Development Projection Methods for Microcomputers

Has been developed by the Population Division to accompany its manual Projection Methods for Integrating Population Variables into Development Planning. All projection techniques presented in the three Modules of the Manual are available to microcomputer users through the PDPM/PC package. PDPM/PC is ideally suited both as a tool in training courses and for applying a scenario approach to national policy formation.

Because of PDPM/PC's modular structure, the user may connect projections made for different sectors.

For example, population projections may be connected to school enrolment projections.

These in turn may provide input for projecting government expenditure in education. Several alternative sets of assumptions (scenarios) can easily be created and the resulting projections compared.

The projection methods incorporated in PDPM/PC include: population projections, household projections, school enrolment projections, employment projections; income projections, consumption and savings projections; and government expenditure projections. Furthermore, since many of these methods require parameter estimation, an ordinary least squares (OLS) routine is built into PDPM/PC. Almost all projection methods in PDPM/PC can be used with national-level data or with disaggregated urban/rural data.
