4,6 million young people aged15-24 are unemployed

 Among the 25 to 29 years old, around 2,8 million are without a job

JEUNESSE

•In total, with about 7,4 million unemployed young people in the EU, young people aged 15-29 represent 38,5% of the total unemployed.

• The youth unemployment rate amounts to 17,5%.

• 30,1% of all young unemployed aged 15-24 are long-term unemployed.

 Significant gender gap in youth employment
