

In the most advanced industrially developed nations, poverty and inequality are growing at an alarming speed, while in many developing nations of Latin America and Asia new approaches to social development are being carried out resulting in greatly decreased levels of poverty and raised standards of living for historically marginalized people. As volunteerism grows around the globe, voluntary service innovators are forging new strategies to tackle these problems, and looking at what works best and leads to real solutions that are sustainable.
