










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
Adolescent childbearing still high in some areas of the world





Early marriage linked to early childbearing



Percentage of Governments adopting measures to raise / enforce minimum age at marriage


Percentage of females age 15-19 who are married or in a consensual union


Substantial inequities among countries in maternal mortality


Substantial gaps persist in meeting the demand for family planning


Measures to reduce maternal deaths






