Andre Kamenshikov is the regional representative of Nonviolence International (USA) in the post - soviet states. He is also the founder of Nonviolence International - CIS. He has been an activist in the peacebuilding field in conflict areas of the ex-USSR since 1992 and as such worked in the regions of Transdniestria, Abhazia, Chechnya and others. His education is in sociology.

He was one of the initiators and a member of the Coordinating Council of the CIS NGO Working Group on Conflict Management and Prevention as well as the regional initiator for the "West CIS" region in the Global Partnership for the Prevention of Armed Conflict (GPPAC).

His current work involves developing local capacities for peace in areas of potential and acute violent conflict, primarily in the North Caucasus region of the Russian Federation, where he works closely with a group of local NGOs and civil activists.
