

Mr. Bombande is a co-founder of the West Africa Network for Peacebuilding and the Executive Director. He is a Peacebuilding Practitioner, International Trainer in Conflict Mitigation and Prevention across Africa and beyond with a strong background in conflict analysis. He has been a lead mediator in many community based mediation efforts in West Africa. He is a member of a Government of Ghana Special Committee to promote peace in the Northern Region of Ghana and an International Trainer with CARITAS International. He teaches a Negotiation Course at the Kofi Annan International Peacekeeping Training Centre as an External Faculty of the Pearson Peacekeeping Training Centre in Canada. He also teaches conflict analysis at the University of Ghana, Legon Centre for International Affairs and served as Trainer in Natural Resources Conflict Management in a Sustainable Livelihood Programme with the FAO in Ghana. His practicum work as part of his Masters of Art studies in Conflict Transformation has focused on intra-communal conflicts in Northern Ghana. Among others, his work has promoted collaborative approaches to peacebuilding in West Africa and the Great Lakes Region of Africa. Apart from two working languages, English and French, he speaks several Ghanaian languages including Hausa, a West Africa lingua franca.
