Lisa Aronson, M.S.W., J.D., Ph.D., is a clinical child and family psychologist and a consultant to traumatized communities. From 2002-2005, she was the director of the Center for the Study of Mind and Human Interaction at the University of Virginia and the editor of its journal, *Mind and Human Interaction*. Prior to this, she directed the child evaluation division of the Trauma Psychiatry Service at the UCLA Neuropsychiatric Institute. She has consulted for the Pan American World Health Organization to mental health workers in Central America following Hurricane Mitch, for the American Jewish World Service to mental health professionals in Turkey following the 1999 earthquake, and most recently to psychosocial providers serving the Beslan, N.Ossetia population in the wake of the terrorist/hostage attack in Beslan. She has presented widely on traumatized communities and children and families as well as published chapters and journal articles on these subjects.
