INDIA

- Size : sub continental
- Population : more than 1000 Million
- Languages : 17 Official languages
- HDI : 127 in a total of 177 countries
- HPI : 58 among 103 developing countries
- GDI : 98 out of 140 countries

Synchronous Decennial Census

- Synchronous Census is conducted every 10 years.
- Collects and presents data separately by gender on various socio-cultural and demographic aspects.
- Provides basic counts of single years
- Lays emphasis on individual characteristics.
- 1991 Census definition worker amplified to include unpaid work by women on family farms or family enterprises.
