The WHAT and the HOW!

- Research: "any systematic effort to increase the stock of knowledge"
- Policy: a "purposive course of action followed by an actor or set of actors"

"Policy research on African agriculture is long on prescriptions for <u>what</u> needs to be done – but short on <u>how</u>..." (Omamo, 2004)



Challenges in southern African R&D

- <u>Complexity:</u> co-existence of different policy objectives *i.e.* economic growth, social welfare and natural resource conservation.
- Regional Integration-poor institutional arrangements
- <u>Diversity</u>: various groups in socio-political systems, poor targeting.
- Funding: poorly funded, understaffed public institutions
- Research priorities: academic pursuit, no monitoring of impact, no think tanks
- · Policy- link between research and policy makers is poor

R&D Challenges in Dry areas

· Governance:

infrastructure

incentives-risk mitigation, rewards for good practices information on environment

- Socio-political systems –diverse livelihoods, limited asset base, poverty trap, HIV and AIDS
- Economic opportunities-limited, risky opportunistic behaviour
- Researchers located away from Target clients.

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




