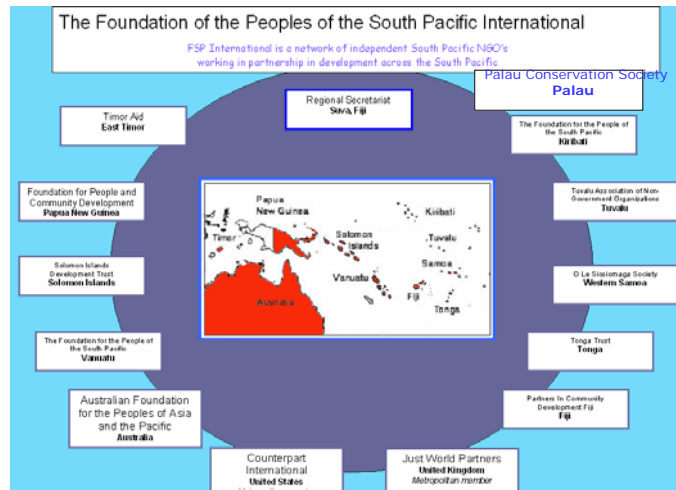

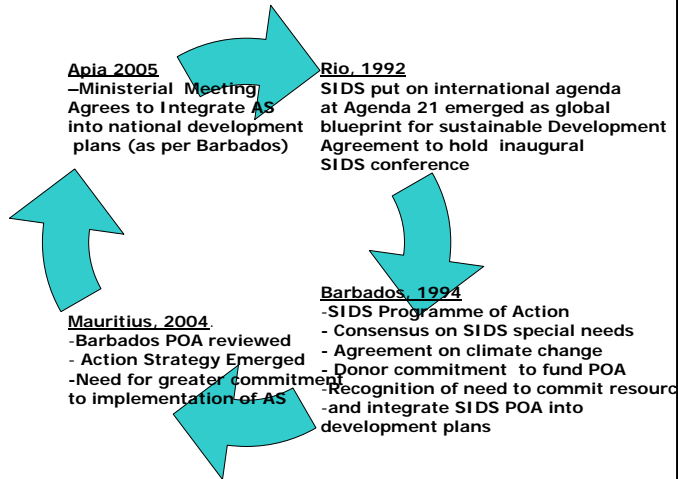


Empowerment, Partnership, Engagement



- a genuine re-commitment to a bottom-up approach that empowers people in an inclusive and participatory manner;
- sound partnerships that will require substantial amendments to how the UN conceives of itself and does business; and
- recognition that genuine policy dialogue, engagement and action are key to the SIDS Action Strategy in general and sustainable rural livelihoods in particular.
