## GENERAL INFORMATION

### Registration

Registration of participants will take place in the Congress registration area of the Queen Sirikit National Convention Centre, located in Zone A, upper level entrance hall. The registration desk will be open from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

In preparation for the high-level segment, the registration desk will be open on 22 and 23 April from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m.

### Opening meeting of the Congress

The opening meeting of the Congress will be held on Monday, 18 April 2005, in Halls 2 and 3, and will start promptly at 10 a.m. In order that the opening meeting may begin punctually, participants are urged to be seated by 9.45 a.m.

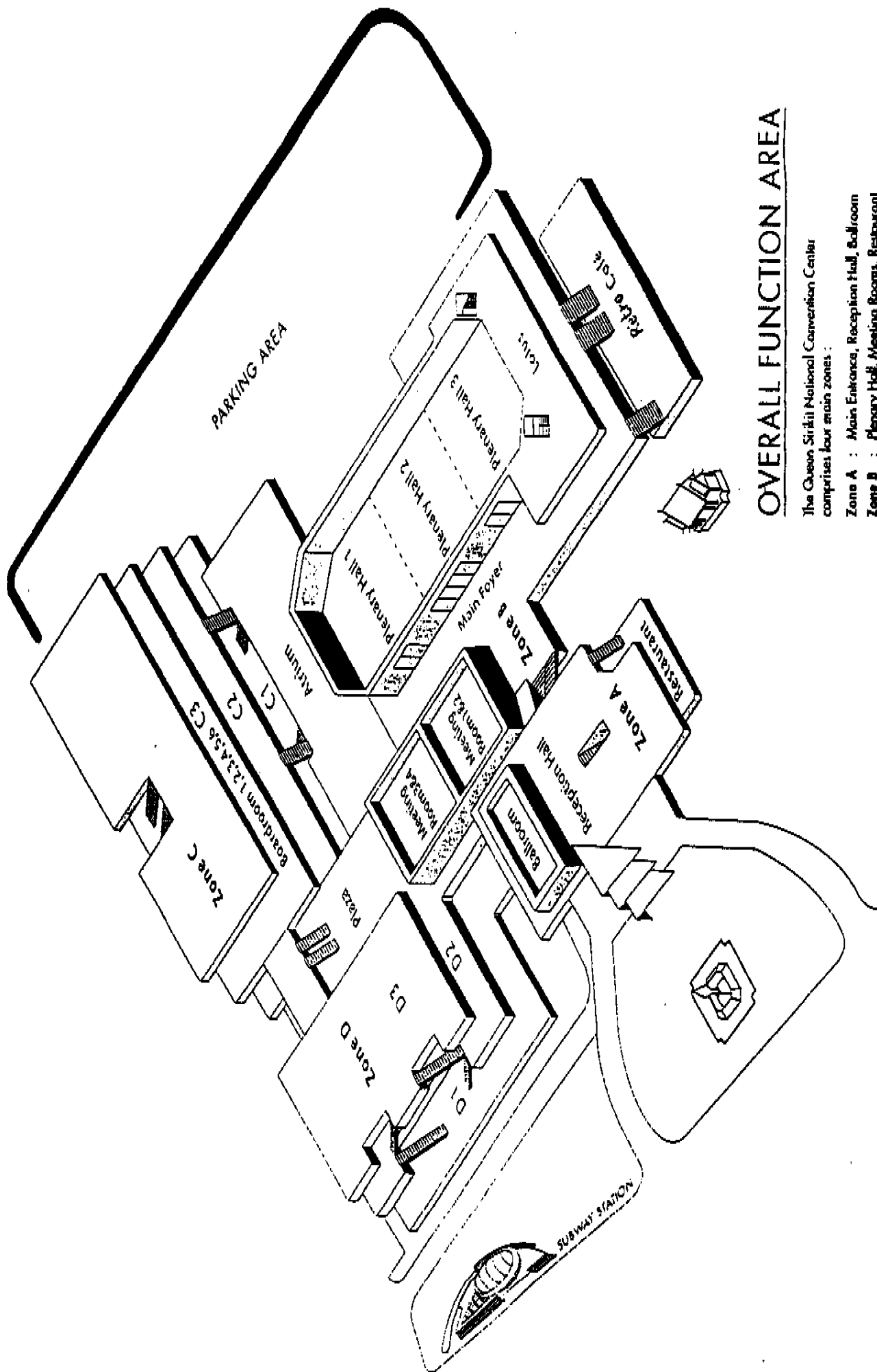
#### **Technical visits**
