4th plenary meeting

Partnership Plenary [8]

Agriculture

The ex-officio Vice-President of the Summit, H.E. Dr. Nkosazana Clarice Dlamini Zuma, Minister of Foreign Affairs of South Africa, opened the Partnership Plenary.

Mr. S. Swaminathan of the M.S. Swaminathan Foundation and Mr. Pedro Sanchez, Executive Director of the International Center for Research in Agroforestry, acting as presenters, made a statements.

Mr. Jan Pronk, Special Envoy of the Secretary-General on the World Summit on Sustainable Development, acting as moderator, addressed questions to a panel composed of: major groups – youth, women, trade unions, scientific and technological communities, non-governmental organizations, local authorities, indigenous people, farmers, business; World Bank, Food and Agricultural Organization of the United Nations, International Fund for Agricultural Development, UNCTAD, International Labour Organization and United Nations Development Programme, to which the panellists responded.

The following representatives then entered into an interactive dialogue: Cape Verde, the United States of America, Austria, Iraq, Uruguay, Lesotho, United Republic of Tanzania, Côte d'Ivoire, Bangladesh, Ethiopia, Malawi, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Equatorial Guinea, Australia, Syrian Arab Republic, Romania, Senegal, South Africa and Venezuela.

The representative of the Consultative Group on International Agricultural Research, an intergovernmental organization, participated in the dialogue.

The representative of the European Commission, on behalf of the European Community, participated into the dialogue.

Representatives from the following major groups also participated in the dialogue: indigenous people and business and industry.

The moderator made some concluding remarks.

The Vice-President of the Summit, H.E. Mr. Srgjan Kerim (Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia), opened the Partnership Plenary.

Mr. Nitin Desai, Secretary-General of the Summit made an introductory statement.

Mr. Jan Pronk, Special Envoy of the Secretary-General on the World Summit on Sustainable Development, acting as moderator, opened the debate by addressing questions to a panel composed of the representatives of: major groups - youth, women, trade unions, scientific and technological communities, non-governmental organizations, local authorities, indigenous people, farmers, business; United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, United Nations Development Programme, United Nations Environment Programme, United Nations Industrial Development Organization, United Nations Institute for Training and Research, UNCTAD, World Trade Organization, World Bank; Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, World High Technology Society and UN Information and Communication Technologies Task Force, to which the panellists responded.

The following representatives then entered into an interactive dialogue: Saudi Arabia, Burkina Faso, Finland, Zambia, Yugoslavia, Pakistan, Ghana, Benin, Bangladesh, Uruguay, Sweden, Equatorial Guinea, Norway, Côte d'Ivoire, Japan, Cuba, Nepal, United States of America and Botswana.

A representative of the European Space Agency participated in the dialogue.

Representatives from the following major groups also participated into the dialogue: women; business and industry.

The moderator made some concluding remarks.
