8th plenary meeting

Partnership Plenary [8]

Regional implementation

The Summit began consideration of agenda item 8 of “regional implementation”.

The ex-officio Vice-President of the Summit, H.E. Dr. Nkosazana Clarice Dlamini Zuma, Minister of Foreign Affairs of South Africa, opened the Partnership Plenary.

Mr. Gustave Speth, Professor of Yale University and former Administrator of the United Nations Development Programme, acting as Moderator, made an introductory statement.

Ms. Brigitta Schmögnerová, Executive Secretary of the Economic Commission for Europe; Mr. Jose Antonio Ocampo, Executive Secretary of the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean; Mr. Kim Hak-Su, Executive Secretary of the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific; Mr. K.Y. Amoako, Executive Secretary of the Economic Commission on Africa and Ms. Mervat M. Tallawy, Executive Secretary, Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia, acting as presenters, made statements.

Mr. Gustave Speth moderated the discussion among the following panelists: Women’s Environment and Development Organization, the Minister of Environment of Croatia, African Ministerial Conference on Environment, International Centre for Environment and Development, Council of Europe, United Nations Development Programme/Regional Office of Asia and Pacific, Amazonian Environmental Funds, International Centre for Agricultural Research in Dry Areas, the Minister of Environment of Georgia, African Development Bank, Palestinian National Environment Authority, United Nations Environment Programme/Regional Office of Latin America and Caribbean, Pacific Islands Forum, United Nations Development Programme, Asian Development Bank, South Asia Cooperative Environment Programme and Environmental Data Initiative.

The following representatives then entered into an interactive dialogue: Brazil, South Africa, Denmark (on behalf of the European Union) Israel, Switzerland, Indonesia, Romania, Tajikistan, Tuvalu, Azerbaijan and Argentina.

The representatives of the Corporación Andina de Fomento and the League of Arab States, intergovernmental organizations, participated in the dialogue.

The moderator made some concluding remarks.
