#### TIME-LIMIT FOR STATEMENTS

GENERAL STATEMENTS (29 AND 30 AUGUST)  
GENERAL DEBATE (2-4 SEPTEMBER)

A timer system will be installed on the lectern for the general statements to be delivered on the afternoon of 29 August and on 30 August and for the general debate to be held from 2 to 4 September. At the beginning of each statement, the timer will be set at five minutes and will indicate the time elapsed. A yellow warning light will alert speakers after three minutes have elapsed and a red flashing light and warning tone will indicate that the five-minute time-limit has been exceeded.

#### Credentials of representatives to the Summit

Delegations are kindly reminded that in accordance with rule 3 of the rules or procedure of the Summit, the credentials of representatives shall be submitted to the Secretary-General of the United Nations if possible not less than one week before the opening of the Summit. The credentials shall be issued either by the Head of State or Government or by the Minister of Foreign Affairs. Delegations who have not yet done so should submit their credentials to the Secretariat of the Summit as soon as possible.

10th plenary meeting
