

Eugene Linden, Author

Eugene Linden writes about the environment, nature, and social issues. In Feb. 2006, Simon and Schuster will publish *The Winds of Change: Climate, Weather, and the Destruction of Civilizations*, which in 2007 won the Grantham Prize's Special Award of Merit. He is the author of seven other books, including *The Future in Plain Sight: The Rise of the "True Believers" and Other Clues to the Coming Instability*.

For many years Linden wrote about global environmental issues for TIME. His work there included a number of celebrated cover stories including *Lost Tribes*, *Lost Knowledge* about the loss of indigenous knowledge around the world (a finalist for a National Magazine Award), *The Last Eden*, which recounted his trip into a rainforest that had not been visited by humans in over 1,000 years, and TIME's *Planet-of-the-Year* special issue in 1988. He published his first major article in 1972, when *Saturday Review* featured his investigation of fragging in Vietnam. Since then, he has contributed articles, essays and op-eds to *The New York Times*, *Foreign Affairs*, *National Geographic*, *The New York Times Magazine*, *The Wall Street Journal*, *Atlantic*, *Fortune*, *Conde Nast Traveler*, *Smithsonian*, *Parade*, and *Slate*, among other publications. Linden is the winner of numerous journalistic awards, and in 2001 was named by Yale as a Poynter Fellow in honor of his work in environmental journalism.

Apart from his writing, Linden serves as Chief Investment Strategist for Bennett Management, a family of investment funds. He also serves on several corporate and non-profit boards. He lives outside New York City.
