



Joseph Stiglitz, the most cited economist in the world, (June 2008) is a recipient of the Nobel Memorial Prize in Economic Sciences (2001) and of the John Bates Clark Medal (1979). Former Senior Vice President and Chief Economist of the World Bank, he is also known for his critical view of management of globalization, free-market economies and some International Institutions like the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank. In 2000 Stiglitz founded the Initiative for Policy Dialogue (IPD), he chairs the University of Manchester's Brooks World Poverty Institute and is a member of the Pontifical Academy of Social Sciences.
