Can the UN provide financial help to students?

The United Nations does not provide financial assistance to students. It is an organization of sovereign States whose funds are allocated only to programmes which are officially approved by its Member States.

You can find some information about scholarships offered by higher education institutions and international organizations in a guide published by UNESCO, entitled "Study Abroad 2004-2005". The guide covers 145 countries and includes some 3,000 entries on courses and scholarships in different higher-education academic and professional disciplines; addresses (including Internet sites); admission requirements; application deadlines; financial aid; fees; living expenses and other relevant information. Entries are presented in English, French and Spanish according to the language of the country concerned.
