The greater risk of exposure, in particular in sub-Saharan Africa, combined with biological susceptibility, means HIV continues to disproportionately affect young women and adolescent girls. Empowering adolescent girls and young women to claim their rights, protect their sexual and reproductive health, access services and live free of violence and discrimination is at the core of ending the AIDS epidemic.
