SUB – COMMISSION ON DEMARCATION JOINT TECHNICAL TEAM
AND SUB – COMMISSION ON DEMARCATION MEETINGS
YAOUNDE 18-20 APRIL 2006**

UNOWA/CNMC Dakar - 18 April 2006. The Cameroon - Nigeria Mixed Commission is holding meetings of the Joint Technical Demarcation Sub-Commission on Demarcation in Yaoundé on the 18th and 19th April to examine different issues concerning the land boundary demarcation between Cameroon and Nigeria.

The Joint Technical Team Sub-Commission on Demarcation will examine the report on the demarcation cost and the joint report on the First phase of the Field Assessment to identify the boundary pillar positions over a distance of more than 400 km. The Joint Technical Team will also examine the specific issues rising from the First phase of the Field Assessment.

Furthermore, the Joint Technical Team Sub-Commission on Demarcation will discuss on the planning for the next phase of the Field Assessment

Proposals for solving specific matters regarding the demarcation process will be examined. These specific matters have been a matter of discussion between the experts from United Nations, Cameroon and Nigeria

The Cameroon Nigeria Mixed Commission Sub-Commission on Demarcation is holding the 13th meeting to approve the Joint Technical Team report and to evaluate the recent financial contributions from two donor countries, Canada and European Union.

The two parties and the United Nations hope that the Bakassi issue will be solved very soon.
