\* UNRWA's Quick Response Plan incorporates all of the Agency's emergency funding needs in Gaza between January-December 2009, in effect superseding the *2009 oPt Emergency Appeal* (Gaza portion only) for this period, and the *UNRWA Gaza Flash Appeal*, which was launched in early January. Ongoing and planned emergency interventions, as outlined in those plans, have been adjusted and expanded to meet the increasing needs arising from the recent conflict; where necessary, for example in the education sector, new interventions have been developed. Total funding requirements between January and December 2009 are estimated at US\$371.3 million.
