Informal High-Level Event on promoting the early entry into force of the Paris Agreement on climate change

New York, 22 April 2016 2:30-3:15 p.m. Conference Room 4

On 12 December 2015, the international community agreed unanimously to keep global temperature rise to well below 2 degrees Celsius above pre-industrial levels and, given the grave risks, to strive to limit warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius. On 22 April, during the High-Level Signing Ceremony for the Paris Agreement, world leaders will further signal their commitment and political will to the transition to low-carbon and climate-resilient economies by taking the first important step on the path towards bringing the Paris Agreement into force.

In the lead-up to the Signing Ceremony, many countries have announced their intention to ratify the Paris Agreement either on 22 April or at some point during 2016. These and many other countries have signaled their support for the Paris Agreement's early entry into force and its prompt implementation.

This Informal High-Level Event will celebrate the leadership of those countries who are in a position to deposit their instruments of ratification during the Signing Ceremony, and provide an opportunity for other countries in attendance to commit to taking the steps necessary to join as soon as possible, with a view to joining in 2016. Countries that have already joined or that will make this commitment will be invited to participate in a photo opportunity at the beginning of the event and to reflect their commitment in the high-level statement. This will build further political momentum for the early entry into force of the Paris Agreement and its prompt implementation.
