

In 2016, with the support of PwC, Microsoft, the International Telecommunications Union, and the UN Office of Partnerships, the inaugural ID2020 Summit brought together over 400 people to discuss how to provide a unique digital identity to every person on the planet, including the 1.5 billion people living without any form of recognized identification. The event was a resounding success, drawing significant public and private-sector attention to the issue of digital identity and receiving significant coverage in both print and social media.

ID2020 will convene the 2017 Summit on June 19th, 2017 in New York City. This year's event will move from high-level discussion into development of a coordinated roadmap for action that leverages the expertise of participants from both the public and private sectors.

In the morning the "Platform for Change" summit will highlight the critical importance of identity as an enabler of economic opportunity and explore the role that technology could play in providing a solution.

In the afternoon, a smaller group (~120 people) will shift into breakout groups at Microsoft's Technology Hub. Each one will focus on a different thread of activity that we believe is necessary to reach the 2030 SDG target. We hope that each of these discussions will yield a high-level roadmap, highlight where coordination is required, and solicit support from those in the room.
