Synopsis

International debates and policies are increasingly addressing the human rights challenges caused by migration and displacement. The universality of human rights, as enshrined in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, entails that civil and political rights – including the right to participate in the public affairs of one's home country – are human rights of all persons, irrespective of migratory status. Ensuring that those rights are guaranteed is very much in line with the 2030 Agenda's commitment to "leave no one behind" and "reach those who are furthest behind first."

On 9 December, 2016, International IDEA and UNDP, in partnership with the Permanent Missions of Ireland and Mexico to the United Nations, organized a one-day "Round Table on Political Participation in Times of Mass Migration and Refugee Crises". The event continued the momentum built by the 2016 High-Level Summit for Refugees and Migrants and aimed at creating awareness for their political rights in the lead up to the 2018 Global Compact on Refugees and the Global Compact on Safe, Regular and Orderly Migration. Discussion points ranged from the legal framework for out-of-country voting (OCV), to candidate and political party registration, to logistical and political challenges, as well as the importance of 'inclusiveness' in peace building processes and transitional elections.

The results of the Round Table where compiled into a report which will be launched on Monday, 11 December 2017, on the occasion of Human Rights Day. Mindful of the Preparatory Stocktaking Meeting on Global compact for safe, orderly and regular migration taking place in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico from 4 to 6 December 2017, the event seeks to provide opportunities for further reflection on the political participation opportunities of migrants and refugees in advance of the intergovernmental consultations and negotiations culminating in the planned adoption of the global compact for migration at an intergovernmental conference on international migration in 2018.
