#### NARRATION

Since it opened six months ago, this clinic in Muyinga Province has treated 95 women and girls, more than half of them under the age of 18. (10.4)

Run by the Society for Women Against AIDS in Africa, the clinic combines medical care with psychological and legal support as well as HIV counselling and testing. (11.3)
