KOLKATA CITY STREETS Kolkata, India. One of the most densely TRAFFIC inhabited cities in the world and a magnet for people from the impoverished countryside. NEPALI COUNTRYSIDE Among them are victims of human trafficking, FARMERS / WOMEN WORKING including women from neighbouring Nepal. In WOMAN SMOKING / the red light district here Nepali women are MAN STANDING / LOOKING considered 'exotic' by Indian men. TRAFFIC IN INDIA/BUSY STREET	NARRATION Sushma first went to Nepal's capital, Kathmandu, to work in a rug factory but the prospect of better pay brought her to Kolkata There she was sold for sexual slavery. Miraculously, she managed to escape. (13.7")

CITY VIEW AT NIGHT	<u>NARRATION</u> What is so unusual about Sushma's story is that once free she set out to find her trafficker. (5.35")			
NIGHT/SUSHMA GETTING READY / CAR DRIVING TOWARDS A HOUSE	Back in Kathmandu, Sushma leads the police to the house where she met the people that took her to Kolkata. (6")

PRISON, KALE DAMAI / PRISON DOOR CLOSING BEHIND HIM / SUSPECT BEHIND BARS / SUSHMA PICKING UP PLASTIC BAG / SUSHMA AND SANGEETA IN THE CAR Sushma did press charges and now the men who sold her are in jail, facing a possible 20 years in prison. (6.4")

Now it's time for Sushma to go home. (1.6")

After a 12-hour journey from Kathmandu, Sushma arrives at her village. (4.3")

SUSHMA AT HER HOUSE GIVING FOOD TO HER CHILDREN Reunited with her children, the difficulty of providing for her family remains, but for now, Sushma is just happy to be home. (10")
