NARRATION

Women risked their lives to gain Timor Leste's independence - and today they are succeeding in changing the politics of this tiny South-East Asian island. Maria Paixão is now Vice President of the country's parliament, where one in three lawmakers are women – a higher proportion than in many developed countries. (19)

But women still face serious obstacles – most are barred from inheriting property, domestic violence remains a widespread problem and women typically have less schooling than men. (11)

Working with her female colleagues, Maria Paixão has founded the Women's Parliamentary Caucus. Jean D'Cunha is UNIFEM's Regional Programme Director. (10)

JEAN D'CUNHA: (English) **F** *"It is extremely important for women to be involved in politics because it is the right of women to politically participate."* (8)

<u>NARRATION</u> Carmelita Moniz is one of the MPs who meet regularly with the caucus. (4.2)

<u>CARMELITA MONIZ</u>: (Portuguese) **F** "The main women's issue that needs to be addressed in Parliament is the law on domestic

violence. (7.2) This should be the priority." (2.15)

<u>NARRATION</u> A crucial aim for Maria Paixão is to foster women's confidence. She wants them to dream higher. (6)

MARIA PAIXÃO: (Portuguese) **F** *"My dream is that by 2020 I would like to see a woman president in Timor-Leste.* (7.15) *In my opinion not only men are able to hold this position...* (5.13) *...but women are also qualified to lead the country."* (3.2)

<u>NARRATION</u> After a busy working day, Maria Paixão greets her granddaughters. (4)

<u>MARIA PAIXÃO</u>: (Portuguese) **F** *"I tell my granddaughters to have self-esteem and self-respect, so they may pass it on to their girlfriends and to all Timorese women."* (11)

NARRATION

For Maria Paixão, the struggle has changed. This time it's a struggle that starts at home – the empowerment of her country's women. (10)
