MATERNITY WARD PATIENTS WITH NURSES AND MIDWIVES	NARRATION Supporting maternal health services, establishing temporary and mobile clinics for tens of thousands of pregnant women in the disaster area is a priority for the government. (11)
MOTHER HOLDING BABY DURING COUNSELING	The women here have access to counseling, supplies, and techniques they would otherwise be without. (6.5)
YOUTH LEADER DISTRIBUTES CONDOMS IN CAMP	Young people are an essential asset to community health. Engaging and mobilizing them to support family planning and maternal health efforts throughout the country is critical. (10.5)
SEXUAL HEALTH COUNSELING SESSION IN TENT	Here, youth Leaders travel around camps, distributing condoms and teaching young people how to protect themselves from HIV and other sexually transmitted diseases. (10.5)
IGOR BOSC ON CAMERA	IGOR BOSC: (English) M "It's very important that youth have access to counseling on family planning, have access to condoms, have access to counseling on prevention of sexually transmittable diseases." (8.5)
CHILDREN PLAY OUTSIDE GIRL WASHES CLOTHES	NARRATION The international community is working together to ensure that programs and practices offer sustained protection for women and young girls. (9)

LATRINES AND SOLAR LIGHT INSTALLATIONS	One example is the use of solar lights that illuminate the paths to latrines and other areas where safety is a concern. (8)
DIGNITY KIT DISTRIBUTION	Another unique initiative is the Dignity Kit, which is distributed in the thousands to women in camps. These kits contain towels, condoms, sanitary items, a rape whistle, and other essentials that are in short supply. (16)

SHAKA DANCE TROUPE AND CHILDREN	<u>NARRATION</u> Altogether, these efforts are helping Haitians to recover – and to lay the groundwork for a better future. (8)
IGOR BOSC ON CAMERA CHILDREN DANCE	IGOR BOSC: (English) M "The needs are huge. However, little by little we're trying to set up the proper networks for protection of women and children." (6)
