VIDEO AUDIO NARRATION NATSOT - WAVES, BEAUTY SHOTS/MUSIC VISUALS OF SEA WATER A puzzling sight on Trinidad & Tobago's southwestern DISSOLVE TO DEAD FISH coast – fishermen spotted thousands of dead fish littered along the beach front in late 2009...not even the birds ate the carcasses. (13.5")DEAD FISH ON SHORE As the evening tide rolled in, the fish - mostly sardines -BIRD FLYING AROUND washed up along the shoreline. The industry is booming.

Blasting for natural gas causes underground rock to

fracture, releasing gas, forcing it back to the surface.

But this means little to Dragon and his community.

They say it's affecting an already low fish stock and is putting the country's fishing industry in peril. (9.5")

Former Minister of Trinidad & Tobago's Energy sector, Carolyn Seepersad Bachan, says that while she has no specific knowledge of why the beaches were packed with dead fish in 2009, accidents do happen. (12.5")
