# **BREECH ON-CAMERA CUTAWAYS**

BREECH ASHER HARANI: (In English) M "'Blue' is a kind of character that left his family in order for him to experience new life in a foreign place. But that didn't end well. The thing is these people try to do drugs, do crime, things unimaginable- in order for them to forget about the discrimination they are facing everyday in a foreign place." (23)

# BREECH IN NEW YORK CITY

Something that Breech himself experienced when he was growing up in Compostela Valley, a province in southern Philippines. (8)

BREECH ASHER HARANI: (In English) M "When I was a kid, my friends and classmates, they treated me like I was somebody that shouldn't be near them. They told me I was ugly. Seeing and hearing people doing that to me every day really hurt." (12)

NARRATION Frustrated by the way his peers treated him, Breech thought of killing himself. (5)

BREECH ASHER HARANI: (In English) M "But I realized that committing suicide is not a solution. I decided to focus on the academics. I decided to be a strong person. And if you connect to the story of the migrants, it jives with the story we have seen from my film, 'Blue'." (18)

Breech's efforts paid off. His film received the prestigious "International Jury Award" at the Plural+ Festival, a youth-produced video competition focusing on migration, diversity and social inclusion. Since 2009, some 1,300 entries from 90 countries vied for the top prize. (18)

<u>BREECH ASHER HARANI</u>: (In English) M "It's really special for me. // I think 'Blue' is very significant when it comes to the work of the United Nations. Because we all know that the UN tackles issues around the world in many aspects of our society. // I think for the youth, they don't need to think of themselves as different. All humans are unique. We should embrace it." (22)
