Since 2002, almost 12,000 children in Northern Uganda have been abducted by the LRA. The abducted children are often forced to become combatants or sex slaves. (12")

AERIAL SHOT OF CAMP FOR DISPLACED PEOPLE

Each evening, an estimated 40,000 children leave home to seek safety in urban centres like this - fearful of attacks or abductions by the LRA.

JANET USING THE SEWING MACHINE

The 19-year conflict has displaced 1.4 million people in the north - with 80 per cent of them being children and women. (8")

Children LIVING IN A CAMP FOR DISPLACED PEOPLE

For Janet, her nightmare is finally over. With a sewing machine provided by a social worker, she can now support her daughter and family as a tailor. (9")

CHILDREN

But, as long as the conflict continues, girls like Janet will be faced with constant threat - a stark reminder that although war is conducted by adults, it is children who bear much of the brunt. (13")
