

Dirk Wels, a native of Weimar, Germany, enjoys a diverse performing career on historical and modern flute, bassoon and recorder. Before relocating to New York City, he pursued studies in Berlin and later in



Luxembourg, where he was principal bassoon of the Orchestre de Chambre de Luxembourg for four years. Dirk has played with baroque, classical and contemporary music ensembles such as Bacchanalia Baroque, Baroquelyn, Camerata New York, Contemporaneous, Distinguished Concerts Orchestra, Delaware Symphony, Double Entendre Music Ensemble, Experiential Orchestra, Garden State Philharmonic, Metamorphosis Chamber Orchestra, New England Symphonic Ensemble, New York Baroque Incorporated, Norwalk Symphony, The Chelsea Symphony, Trinity Baroque Orchestra and Washington Square Festival Orchestra. He can be heard as a flutist in recordings of music by Rob Kapilow and Glen Roven, and as a bassoonist in an album featuring American music for double reed ensemble. Dirk has been featured as a soloist with The Chelsea Symphony on both flute and bassoon and has performed the flute part in Bach's Brandenburg Concerto No.5 with Baroquelyn and the recorder part in Telemann's Double Concerto with Bacchanalia Baroque. This fall will mark his debut performance as contrabassoonist with the world-renowned Canadian Tafelmusik Baroque Orchestra.


