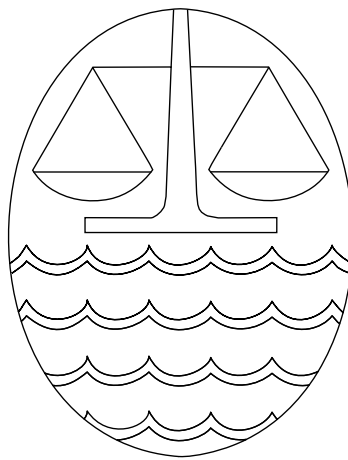

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## I. UNITED NATIONS CONVENTION ON THE LAW OF THE SEA

### STATUS OF THE UNITED NATIONS CONVENTION ON THE LAW OF THE SEA, THE AGREEMENT RELATING TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PART XI OF THE CONVENTION AND THE AGREEMENT FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THE CONVENTION RELATING TO THE CONSERVATION AND MANAGEMENT OF STRADDLING FISH STOCKS AND HIGHLY MIGRATORY FISH STOCKS, AS AT 31 MARCH 2022<sup>1</sup>

#### 1. Table recapitulating the status of the Convention and of its implementing Agreements

## II. LEGAL INFORMATION RELEVANT TO THE UNITED NATIONS CONVENTION ON THE LAW OF THE SEA

### BILATERAL TREATIES

#### 1(a) *Agreement between the Government of Fiji and the Government of Tuvalu concerning their maritime boundaries*<sup>6</sup>

The Sovereign States of Fiji and Tuvalu

DESIRING to strengthen the bonds of friendship between the two States,

RECOGNIZING the need to effect a precise and equitable delimitation of the respective maritime areas in which the two States exercise sovereign rights, and,

BASING themselves on the rules and principles of relevant international law, as they are expressed in the United Nations Convention Law of the Sea, 10 December 1982 to which both Fiji and Tuvalu are a party, and, in particular Article 74 and 83 which provide that the delimitation of the exclusive economic zone and continental shelf between States with opposite or adjacent coasts shall be effected by agreement on the basis of international law, as referred to in Article 38 of the Statute of the International Court of Justice, in order to achieve an equitable solution,

HAVE AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

#### *Article 1*

#### *Maritime Boundary between Fiji and Tuvalu*

(1) The line of delimitation between the exclusive economic zones and continental shelves of Fiji and Tuvalu lies seaward of Rotuma Islands in Fiji on one hand and Niulakita, Nukulaelae, Funafuti, Nukufetau, Nui in Tuvalu Islands on the other hand, along the geodesics connecting the following points, defined by their coordinates, in the order stated below.

(2) The line of delimitation referred to in paragraph 1 of this Article is based on the principle of equidistance between Fiji and Tuvalu.

(3) The geographical coordinates given in this Agreement are determined by reference to the geodetic reference system WGS84 (World Geodetic Reference System 1984)

(4) The line of delimitation drawn on the chart in the Annex to this Agreement is drawn for illustrative purposes only.

#### *Article 2*

#### *Without Prejudice*

It is agreed by both Parties that 'Point 31' (FJ.TV MB 31) in Article 1 of this Agreement will not prejudice any further negotiations with France.

#### *Article 3*

#### *Sovereign Rights*

The lines described in Article 1 of this Agreement shall be the maritime boundary between the areas referred to in the Article 1 in which the Parties, in accordance with international law, exercise any sovereign right or jurisdiction.

*Article 4*  
***Adjustments to Maritime Boundary***

If new surveys or resulting charts and maps should indicate that changes in the base points co-ordinates are sufficiently significant to require adjustments of the maritime boundary, the Parties agree that an adjustment will be carried out on the basis of the same principles as those used in determining the maritime boundary, and such adjustments shall be provided for in a Protocol to this Agreement.

*Article 5*  
***Dispute Resolution***

Any dispute between the parties concerning the interpretation or application of this Agreement shall be settled peacefully through consultation and negotiation in accordance with international law.

*Article 6*  
***Agreement Deposit***

Upon the completion of all national procedures bringing this Agreement into force, each party shall take all the necessary steps to lodge this Agreement, including the coordinates in Article 1, with the appropriate International Bodies.

*Article 7*

Each Party shall notify the other of the completion of its national procedure to bring this Agreement into force.

This Agreement shall enter into force on the date of its signature.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the representatives of the two Governments, being duly authorized for this purpose, have signed this Agreement and have affixed thereto their seals.

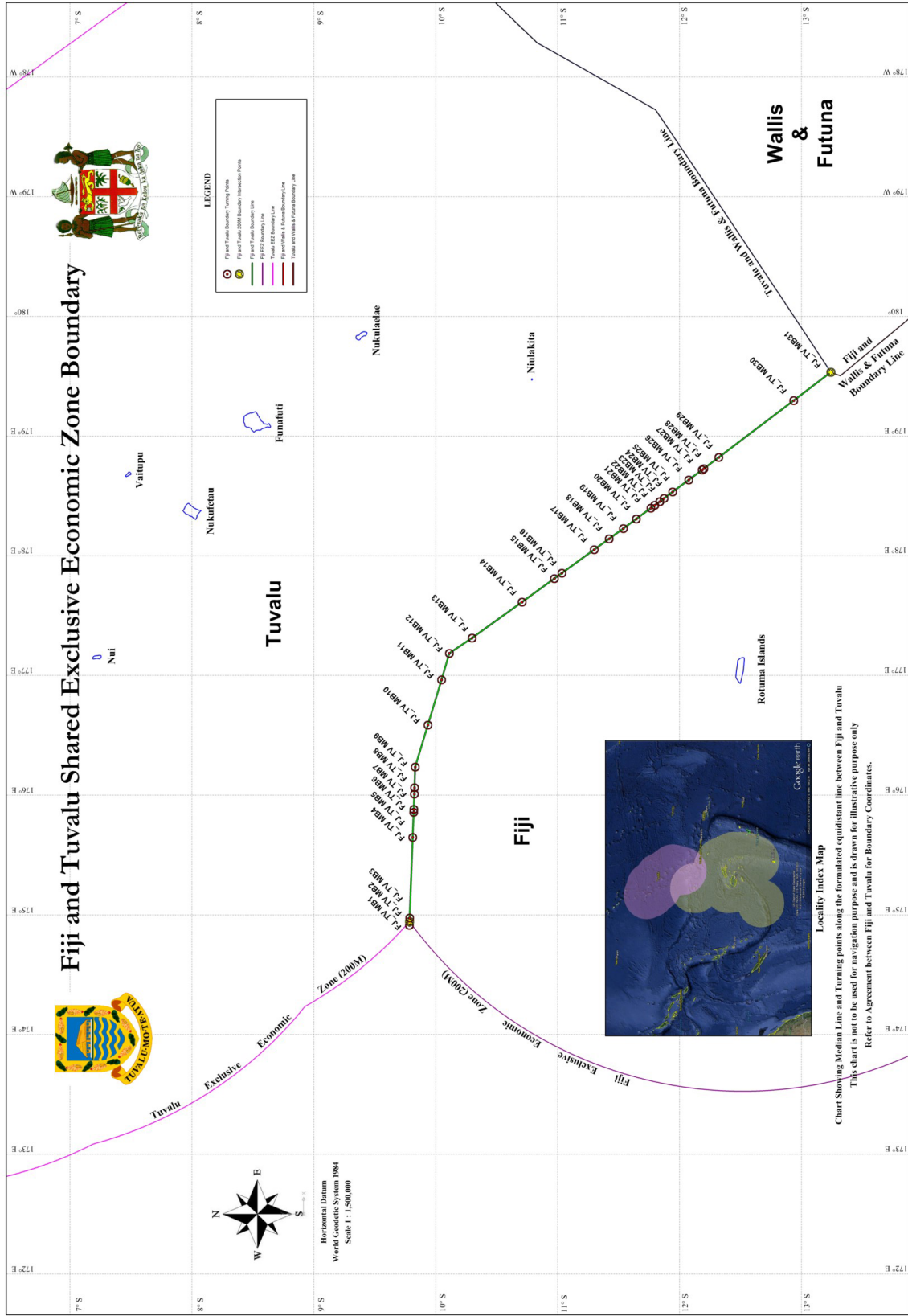

Have agreed to amend Article 1 of the *Agreement between the Government of Fiji and the Government of Tuvalu concerning their Maritime Boundaries* signed in Suva on the 17th October 2014 by exchange of Diplomatic Notes to include the following additional point:

**1(b) Exchange of notes constituting an agreement between the Government of Fiji and the Government of Tuvalu amending Article 1 of the Agreement between the Government of Fiji and the Government of Tuvalu concerning their maritime boundaries<sup>8</sup>**

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Government of the Republic of Fiji presents its compliments to the Tuvalu High Commission in Suva and has the honour to refer to the “Agreement” signed by the Government of the Republic of Fiji and the Government of Tuvalu in Suva on 17 October 2014, concerning the Parties shared maritime boundaries.

The Ministry has the further honour to inform that following consultation between officials of the Government of Fiji, Tuvalu and France, the officials noted that the coordinates denoted below as FJ\_TV MB 32 represent an agreed tri-junction point between the Government of Fiji, Government of Tuvalu and the Government of France (Wallis and Futuna) signed in Suva on 16 September 2015.

The tri-point needs to be annexed to the Agreement signed by the Government of Fiji and the Government of Tuvalu. The Ministry in this connection wishes to propose the amendment of the Agreement to include the agreed tri-junction point below:

## ***2. Agreement between the Hellenic Republic and the Italian Republic on the delimitation of their respective maritime zones<sup>9</sup>***

The Hellenic Republic and the Italian Republic (hereinafter the “Parties” or the “countries”);

DESIRING to strengthen the ties of good-neighbourliness and cooperation between the two countries;

AWARE of the need to delimit precisely the maritime zones over which the two countries are entitled to exercise, respectively, their sovereign rights or jurisdiction in accordance with international law;

TAKING INTO ACCOUNT the relevant provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (1982), to which the two countries are parties;

REAFFIRMING the Agreement between the Hellenic Republic and the Italian Republic on the delimitation of their respective continental shelves, signed on the 24th of May 1977 and entered into force on 12th of November 1980;

RECALLING that the above Agreement establishes a boundary for the delimitation of the continental shelves between the two countries;

WISHING to apply the above continental shelf boundary for the delimitation of other maritime zones to which the two countries are entitled under international law;

HAVE AGREED upon the following:

### *Article 1*

1. The boundary line of the maritime zones to which the two countries are entitled to exercise, respectively, their sovereign rights or jurisdiction under international law shall be the continental shelf boundary established under the 1977 Agreement between the Hellenic Republic and the Italian Republic on the delimitation of their respective continental shelves.

2. The coordinates of the above boundary line expressed in the WGS-84 datum are as follows: [...] <sup>10</sup>

3. The delimitation, for the moment, shall not be intended to go beyond the point 1, to the North, and beyond the point 16, to the South. This delimitation shall be extended in either direction up to the junction points of the maritime zones of the respective neighboring States, once the relevant agreements will be concluded.

### *Article 2*

Once a Party has taken the initiative to proclaim a maritime zone extending up to the boundary line of article 1 of this Agreement, it shall inform the other Party as early as possible.

### *Article 3*

This Agreement is without prejudice to:

- a. fishing activities carried out in conformity with applicable EU rules and regulations;
- b. the provisions of article 58 of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea regarding the rights, freedoms and duties of other States in the exclusive economic zone of the Parties as provided for in the above article.

#### *Article 4*

1. The Parties shall endeavour to settle, through diplomatic means, any dispute which may arise concerning the interpretation or application of this Agreement.

2. If such a dispute is not settled within four months from the date on which one of the Parties gave notice of its intention to initiate the procedure provided for in the preceding paragraph, it shall be referred, at the request of either Party, to the International Court of Justice or to any other international body chosen by mutual consent.

#### *Article 5*

1. This Agreement shall be subject to ratification.

2. This Agreement shall enter into force on the date of exchange of the instruments of ratification.

DONE at Athens, on 9.6.2020, in two originals, each in the Greek, Italian and English languages, all texts being equally authentic. In case of divergence in the interpretation of this Agreement, the text in English shall prevail.

### III. COMMUNICATIONS BY STATES

#### ISRAEL

#### *Letter dated 23 December 2021 from the Permanent Representative of Israel to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General<sup>11</sup>*

Excellency,

I would like to raise my Government's serious concerns regarding the recent tender issued by the Government of Lebanon to grant offshore licenses in maritime areas where Israel asserts sovereign rights or jurisdiction in accordance with international law, as Israel has conveyed in previous letters dated 2 February 2017, 21 December 2017, 11 July 2019, and most recently 23 November 2021.

The Government of Israel submits its formal objection to any non-consensual Lebanese activity in Israeli maritime areas to which Israel has not explicitly consented. Israel objects to any unauthorized economic activity by Lebanon in this area, including, inter alia, the granting of rights by Lebanon to any third party; exploratory activities; drilling; or exploration of natural resources in maritime areas in which Israel asserts sovereign rights or jurisdiction.

Israel is of the view that efforts should be focused on advancing the negotiations between Israel and Lebanon for the delimitation of their maritime boundary, with the aim of reaching an agreed resolution, in a manner that would provide stability and economic benefit for both sides. Therefore, Israel feels obliged to submit its formal objection to the recent activities by Lebanon. Israel calls upon the Government of Lebanon to withdraw this tender and refrain from any activity that would advance any non-consensual activities in Israeli maritime areas.

Israel reiterates its call on all relevant third parties to respect Israel's position and to refrain from participating in, promoting or facilitating, any action that could compromise Israel's rights, and also to refrain from any other involvement in non-consensual economic activities in Israeli maritime areas. Such activity threatens to expose third parties to significant liability.

As Israel has clarified in its previous letter dated 23 November 2021, Israel remains committed to reaching an amicable negotiated resolution on the issue of delimiting our common maritime boundary, and expects Lebanon to demonstrate the same level of commitment.

The Permanent Mission of Israel would be grateful if this letter could be published on the Ocean & Law of the Sea UN website under the countries section of the database on Maritime Space: Maritime Zones Delimitation. In addition, The Permanent Mission of Israel requests to include this information in the next Law of the Sea Bulletin.
