The question concerning Haiti

Report of the Secretary General on the United Nations Stabilization Mission in Haiti S/2010/446

The agenda was adopted without objection.

The President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation to the representatives of Argentina, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Haiti, Norway, Peru and Uruguay, at their request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter and rule 37 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Mr. Edmond Mulet, Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the United Nations Stabilization Mission in Haiti.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended invitations under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Mr. Peter Schwaiger, Deputy Head of the Delegation of the European Union to the United Nations.

The Council began its consideration of the item on the agenda and heard a briefing by Mr. Mulet.

The Council heard a statement by the representative of Haiti.

Statements were made by the representatives of the United States, Brazil, France, Gabon, Mexico, Nigeria, China, the Russian Federation, Japan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Lebanon, Austria, Uganda and the United Kingdom, and by the President, speaking in his capacity as representative of Turkey.

The Council heard a statement by the representative of Uruguay (speaking on behalf of the Group of Friends of Haiti).

The Council heard a statement by Mr. Peter Schwaiger (speaking on behalf of the European Union; the candidate country Turkey; the countries of the Stabilization and Association Process and potential candidates Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro and Serbia; as well as Ukraine, the Republic of Moldova and Georgia, which aligned with this statement).

The Council heard statements by the representatives of Canada, Colombia, Peru, Chile, Argentina and Norway.

The representative of Haiti made a further statement.

Revitalization of the work of the General Assembly: report of the Ad Hoc Working Group on the Revitalization of the General Assembly (A/64/903). [118]

The General Assembly adopted the draft resolution contained in paragraph 64 of the report of the Ad Hoc Working Group on the Revitalization of the General Assembly (A/64/903) (resolution 64/301).

The General Assembly thus concluded its consideration of agenda item 118.

Question of equitable representation on and increase in the membership of the Security Council and related matters [119]

The General Assembly resumed its consideration of agenda item 119.

The representative of India made a statement on a point of order.

The General Assembly decided:

- (a) to immediately continue intergovernmental negotiations on Security Council reform in informal plenary of the General Assembly at its sixty-fifth session as mandated by General Assembly decisions 62/557 of 15 September 2008 and 63/565 of 14 September 2009, building on the progress achieved during its sixty-fourth session, as well as the positions of and proposals made by Member States, while noting with appreciation the initiatives and efforts of the President of the General Assembly and the Chair, including the preparation of the text reflecting the positions of and proposals submitted by Member States, with a view to an early comprehensive reform of the Security Council;
- (b) to convene the Open-ended Working Group on the Question of Equitable Representation on and Increase in the Membership of the Security Council and Other Matters related to the Security Council during the sixty-fifth session of the General Assembly if Member States so decide; and
- (c) to include in the agenda of the sixty-fifth session of the General Assembly an item entitled “Question of Equitable Representation on and Increase in the Membership of the Security Council and Other Matters related to the Security Council”.

The General Assembly thus concluded its consideration of agenda item 119.

The General Assembly decided to defer consideration of item 122 and to include it in the draft agenda of its sixty-fifth session.

The General Assembly thus concluded its consideration of agenda item 122.

Financing of the United Nations Mission in East Timor [151]

The General Assembly decided to defer consideration of item 151 and to include it in the draft agenda of its sixty-fifth session.

The General Assembly thus concluded its consideration of agenda item 151.

The President reminded the General Assembly that the following agenda items, on which action had been taken at previous meetings, still remained open for consideration during the sixty-fourth session of the General Assembly: items 9, 10, 15, 16, 20, 49, 53 (d), 64, 70 (a), 96, 106 to 108, 111 (a) and (e), 112 (f) and (i), 121, 123, 127 to 150, 152 to 163 and 172.

The President recalled that these items had been included in the provisional agenda of the sixty-fifth session of the General Assembly with the exception of sub-item (e) of agenda item 111, sub-item (i) of agenda item 112, items 121, 131, 132, 141, 145 and 147.

The General Assembly thus concluded its consideration of these items at the sixty-fourth session.

The meeting was suspended.

The meeting was resumed.

The General Assembly decided, in view of the ongoing consultations on draft resolution [A/64/L.67](#), to postpone the date of closure of the sixty-fourth session to Tuesday, 14 September 2010.

Multilateral Treaty Framework: An invitation to universal participation

2010 Treaty Event: Towards universal participation and implementation

United Nations Headquarters (21–23 and 27–28 September 2010)

It is recalled that a series of successful treaty events have been held annually at the Headquarters of the United Nations commencing with the Millennium Summit in 2000. This year, the annual treaty event will be held from Tuesday, 21, to Thursday, 23 September, and on Monday, 27, and Tuesday, 28 September 2010, at United Nations Headquarters, to coincide with the general debate of the sixty-fifth session of the General Assembly.

The Event, entitled “2010 Treaty Event: Towards universal participation and implementation”, provides a distinct opportunity for States to demonstrate their continuing commitment to the central role of the rule of law in international relations. This year’s event will highlight treaties of global reach such as human rights, terrorism, penal matters, disarmament, climate change and the protection of United Nations personnel. In particular, this year will highlight a theme which celebrates and safeguards life on earth, biodiversity. 2010 marks the International Year of Biodiversity; it also marks the start of the United Nations Decade for Deserts and the Fight against Desertification, another global issue requiring a global response.

The list of treaties being highlighted this year has been circulated by depositary notification C.N.243.2010.TREATIES-3 of 28 April 2010. As is customary, it will be possible to undertake treaty actions with regard to any treaty deposited with the Secretary-General during the treaty event. Necessary facilities, including media coverage, will be made available for treaty actions to be undertaken in a solemn setting.

Delegations intending to sign or deposit instruments of ratification, acceptance, approval or accession relating to multilateral treaties deposited with the Secretary-General during the treaty event may wish to inform their Governments accordingly for the purpose of completing the requisite domestic procedures.

Under established international practice, only Heads of State, Heads of Government or Ministers for Foreign Affairs are empowered, by virtue of their functions, to sign

treaties on behalf of States without having to produce full powers to that effect. All other representatives wishing to sign treaties must be in possession of appropriate full powers, which expressly authorize signature of specified treaties by a named representative issued and signed by one of these authorities. Likewise, instruments of ratification, acceptance, approval or accession must be issued and signed by the same authorities.

The Secretary-General would be obliged if States wishing to sign, ratify or accede to any of the treaties could notify and provide copies of full powers/instruments in advance to the Treaty Section.

International Cocoa Agreement, 2001

Geneva, 25 June 2010

Opening for signature

In accordance with its article 54, the above Agreement shall be open for signature in New York from 1 October 2010 until 30 September 2012, by parties to the International Cocoa Agreement, 2001, and Governments invited to the United Nations Conference, 2010.

Certified true copies of the Agreement, of which the Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish texts are equally authentic, will be prepared and will be transmitted to all States as soon as possible.

The Secretary-General takes this opportunity to recall that, under established international practice, only Heads of State, Heads of Government or Ministers for Foreign Affairs are empowered by virtue of their functions, to sign a treaty on behalf of a State without having to produce full powers to that effect. Other representatives wishing to sign a treaty must be in possession of appropriate full powers, which expressly authorize signature of a specific treaty by a named representative issued and signed by one of these authorities. Full powers are distinct from credentials. Credentials alone are not adequate for the purpose of signing a treaty.

The Secretary-General would be obliged if States wishing to sign the Agreement could notify, and provide copies of the required full powers in advance to the Treaty Section, Office of Legal Affairs (380 Madison Avenue, New York; e-mail depositaryCN@un.org; tel. 1 (212) 963-5047; fax 1 (212) 963-3693).
