#### Knowledge Products

- Finalized the **Technical Guide on Protecting Critical Energy Infrastructure against Terrorist Attacks**, featuring good practices from around the world.
- Developed tailored **Training Curricula** for capacity-building in Kenya and Indonesia.
- Successfully launched a **cutting-edge e-learning course** in partnership with UNOCT's Sports Programme.



#### Connecting Experts

- **7 Expert Briefings** as part of the **Series for the UN Global Network on Vulnerable Targets Protection** on topics such as the new EU Directive on critical infrastructure resilience, Australia's approach to protecting crowded places, energy infrastructure protection, urban resilience, and disability considerations in a VT context.



#### Capacity-Building

- **10 beneficiary countries** (Benin, Ivory Coast, Indonesia, Kenya, Kyrgyzstan, Mauritania, Senegal, Tajikistan, Togo, Tunisia).
- **5 additional National Action Plans (Roadmaps)** developed for Ivory Coast, Kenya, Kyrgyzstan, Mauritania and Senegal, following in-depth consultations.
- **8 specialized national capacity building activities.**

- **8 High-Level Coordination and Expert activities** organized; such as our launch of the Energy Infrastructure Guide, and the Programme's 2nd Steering Committee Meeting at principal level.

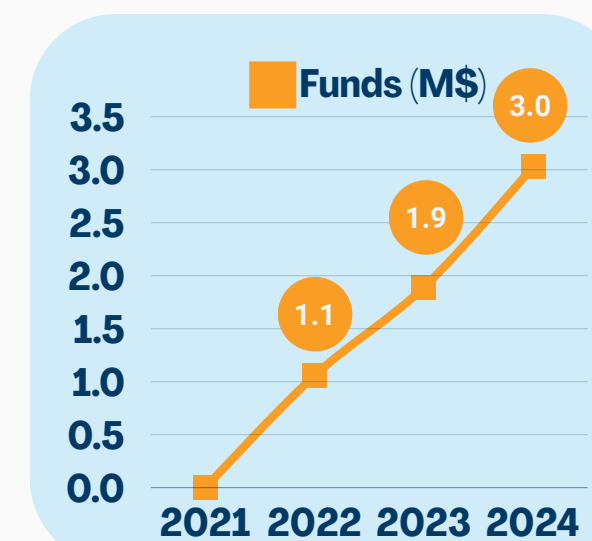
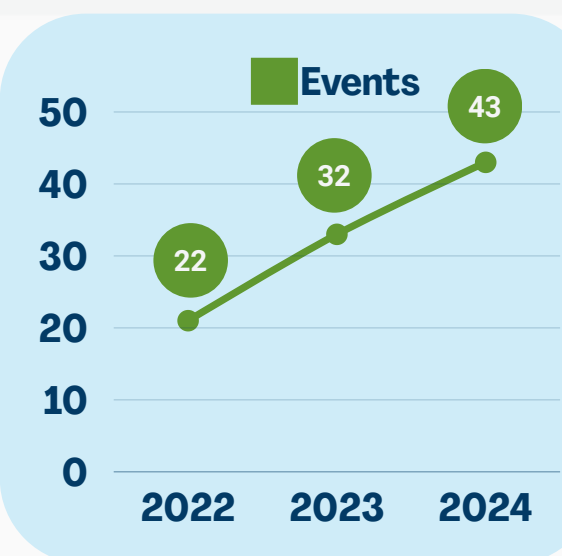
