


UNCCT at a Glance – as of 18 June 2020

In 2019 UNCCT has delivered:



• **95 capacity-building workshops** and **expert level meetings** – 25% increase from 2018



• Engaged over **5,000 beneficiaries** – 90% increase from 2018



 32 Outreach events, panels, seminars and briefings – almost 150% increase from 2018



Annual Report 2019 — Expenditure and Utilization Rates


- Increase in expenditure from \$17.6 million in 2018 to \$20.1 million in 2019 (a 14% increase)
- Budget implementation rate - 75%, up from 69% in 2018


