- New project on Protecting Vulnerable Targets by using Behavioral Insights (BI) to Strengthen Law Enforcement Capabilities: first joint project of the UNOCT Programme Offices in Madrid and Rabat, and the Doha BI Hub (high-level launch, Nov 2022).
- 4 outreach activities with partners such as CEPOL, OSCE, and EU CT Public Spaces.

- Specialized work conducted in 4 beneficiary countries (Indonesia, Tajikistan, Togo, Tunisia).
- 4 roadmaps (national action plans) developed following in-depth consultations.
- 10 national capacity-building activities implemented.
- 8 regional / global activities implemented (e.g. with OSCE, ACSRT).



Connecting Experts

- Global Expert Network on Vulnerable Targets Protection launched—currently the largest community of practitioners on UNOCT Connect&Learn Platform with 150 Members (high-level launch, Feb 2022).
- Expert Briefing Series conducted for the Network: 6 online events on religious sites protection, VT legislation, tourism security, active shooters in major events, cyberattacks against critical infrastructure, and gender & VT.



## Projected Activities - in 2023, the programme will:

**Develop** a new knowledge product on CT protection of energy infrastructure;

Implement capacity-building activities in current and new beneficiary countries;

**Start** the capacity-building phase of the joint project on VT and BI;

**Hold** in-person activities for the Global Network of Experts;

Launch VT e-learning courses;

**Strengthen** partnerships with entities such as ACSRT, EU CT Public Spaces, GCTF and OSCE, the private sector, civil society and academia.
