United Nations to hold its Third Counter-Terrorism Week

New York, 15 June 2023 - Terrorism is a complex, evolving and multi-faceted threat that requires a comprehensive, inclusive, and effective multilateral response. In this context, the United Nations Office of Counter-Terrorism (UNOCT) is organizing the Third Counter-Terrorism Week (CT Week) from 19-23 June 2023 at the United Nations Headquarters in New York.

This biennial gathering will host the Third High-Level Conference of Heads of Counter-Terrorism Agencies of Member States (19 and 20 June). It will also witness the adoption of the Eighth Biennial Review of the United Nations Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy (GCTS) resolution by the General Assembly following a Plenary meeting and General Debate (22 and 23 June). Throughout the week at total of 40 thematic side-events will focus on initiatives related to the four pillars of the GCTS and the overarching theme of the Conference: *"Addressing Terrorism through Reinvigorated Multilateralism and Institutional Cooperation."*

Organized as an in-person event, the Third CT Week will see the participation of the President of the General Assembly (via video message), the Secretary-General of the United Nations, as well as Ministers and senior-level dignitaries of Member States, international and regional organizations, UN Global Counter-Terrorism Compact entities, civil society organizations, and the private sector.

Third High-Level Conference of Heads of Counter-Terrorism Agencies of Member States

The Third High-Level Conference of Heads of Counter-Terrorism Agencies of Member States will discuss the practical implementation of the GCTS (A/RES/60/288) and its review resolutions, in line with Member States' priorities, including those on human rights, gender equality, engagement with youth and civil society, as well as 'whole-of-society' responses. Held under the overarching theme "Addressing Terrorism through Reinvigorated Multilateralism and Institutional Cooperation", it will provide the international community with the opportunity to renew and build upon the existing multilateral, results-oriented and balanced efforts to preventing and countering terrorism under the auspices of the United Nations.

The High-Level Conference will encompass four thematic sessions on: (1) Countering terrorism while ensuring compliance with human rights and rule of law; (2) Building effective and resilient Member States' institutions; (3) Assessing the global threat landscape (session open to Member States only); and (4) strengthening capacity building programmes.

Eighth review of the United Nations Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy (GCTS)

The United Nations General Assembly reviews the GCTS, adopted in 2006, every two years, ensuring its status as a living document attuned to Member States' counter-terrorism priorities. The President of the General Assembly appointed the Permanent Representatives of Canada and Tunisia as co-facilitators to guide Member States' negotiations of the resolution that accompanies the eight review informed by the Report of the Secretary-General (A/77/718) on the Activities of the United Nations system in implementing the United Nations Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy.

Jointly organized by Member States, UN Global Counter-Terrorism Compact Entities and civil society partners, the side events will provide a platform for high-level officials and experts to share their experiences and enhance common efforts in the global fight against terrorism and violent extremism.
