

United Nations Global Counter-Terrorism Coordination Compact Commemoration of International Day for the Prevention of Violent Extremism as and when Conducive to Terrorism

Concept Note & Agenda

Background and Context

In its resolution 77/243, the General Assembly declared 12 February the International Day for the Prevention of Violent Extremism as and when Conducive to Terrorism, to raise awareness of the threats linked to violent extremism, as and when conducive to terrorism, and to enhance international cooperation in this regard.

The General Assembly resolution emphasized in this context the primary responsibility of Member States and their respective national institutions in countering terrorism, and underlined the important role of intergovernmental organizations, civil society, academia, religious leaders, and the media in

countering terrorism and preventing violent extremism as and when conducive to terrorism. The resolution reaffirmed that terrorism and violent extremism as and when conducive to terrorism cannot and should not be associated with any religion, nationality, civilization, or ethnic group. The General Assembly invited the Office of Counter-Terrorism, in collaboration with other relevant entities of the United Nations Global Counter-Terrorism Coordination Compact, to facilitate the observance of the International Day.

Objectives

To commemorate the 2024 International Day for the Prevention of Violent Extremism as and when Conducive to Terrorism, the United Nations Office of Counter-Terrorism will convene an online event, led by the Chair and Vice-Chairs of the Counter-Terrorism Compact Working Group on Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism (PCVE) on 12 February 2024.

Drawing from the eighth review of the United Nations Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy, which reiterates the need for Governments and the international community to enhance cooperation to prevent and combat terrorism in a coordinated, inclusive, transparent and human rights-based, gender-responsive manner, this event will bring the Counter-Terrorism Compact PCVE Working Group together with Member States, civil society, and beneficiaries, to raise awareness of International PVE Day, renew commitments to collaborate on PCVE, and highlight the critical role played by intergovernmental organizations, civil society, academia, as well as religious and young leaders in PCVE.

The event is divided into three segments:

- 1. Senior-level opening remarks, including keynote speeches delivered by the Chair and the three Vice-Chairs of Counter-Terrorism Compact Working Group on Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism conducive to Terrorism.
- 2. A number of Member States, civil society organizations and beneficiaries will share their experiences, focusing on how prevention policies and programme support have assisted them in addressing violent extremist threats within their respective communities. The presentations will also seek to explore the future landscape of violent extremism conducive to terrorism and opportunities for prevention.
- 3. A moderated Interactive discussion from the floor seeks to provide online participants with the space to make dedicated interventions to share their insights, and amplify lessons learned.

This will be followed by short closing remarks by the Chair of the PVE Working Group, Mr. Mauro Miedico, Director of UNCCT.

Date & Time

The event will be organized online (MS Teams) and will take place on 12 February 2024, 10:00 - 11:30 EST.

A 1 hour 30 minutes event for Counter-Terrorism Compact PCVE Working Group members, selected external guests and participants via online platform Microsoft Teams.
